



Social Justice Updates

<u>Capital Area New Mainers Project</u> (CANMP) was created during a snowy, January meeting in 2016. This date coincided with the election of Donald Trump as president of the United States. Capital area people, gathered that night worried and scared for the growing number of immigrants in our area. New immigrants attended this meeting and have been part of the structure of CANMP since its inception. Many members of the UUCC were present and became the first wave of volunteers to welcome and support immigrants, refugees, and asylees as they found home in the Capital Area.

The 2nd Trump administration is making new threats towards immigrants and revoking sanctuary status to churches, schools, medical centers. There are many ways to act with CANMP as it supports and advocates for immigrants. Please visit the website: https://www.newmainersproject.org/.
