

Dear Members and Friends of UUCC,

I hope you are all well. If you are not well, please reach out to me. I am here for you as your minister to listen, to support, to lean into when times are tough. This is a challenging time of the year. Yet, this week is the celebration of the return of the sun. Although we have many winter months ahead, we can rest and rejoice in the days getting longer. And this is a time to make friends with the darkness and the shadow parts of ourselves we prefer to ignore. Carl Jung wrote: "Everyone carries a shadow, and the less it is embodied in the individual's conscious life, the blacker and denser it is. At all counts, it forms an unconscious snag, thwarting our most well-meant intentions." TAX TIP

If you are over 70 ½ you can save taxes by making any charitable contributions by Transferring IRA funds directly to charity. Additionally, these *Qualified Charitable Distributions* count toward your *required minimum distribution* for the year they are dispersed.

Example: Let's say I don't itemize deductions and take the standard deduction and I am in the 15% tax bracket Federally and 5% at the state level then I could either:

- Take \$1000 from my IRA into my income and be left with \$800 for charitable contributions after taxes ---- Or ---
- Transfer the \$1000 to charities directly from my IRA and pay no taxes. The \$1000 is excluded from my income.

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

At the December 8 meeting, the Board:

- Discussed the upcoming search processes
- The interim minister application will be filed with the UUA prior to April 19. The interim search committee should receive names and begin interviews by May 1.
- In either February or March the Board will meet with a representative from the Transitions Office of the UUA who will guide our search for a settled minister. The congregation will approve the members of the search committee at the Annual Meeting in June.
- As part of contractual duties, Rev, Christina will complete job descriptions for all staff and conduct evaluations by January.
- Acted on a recommendation from the Leadership Council that steps be taken to improve microphone use by members of the congregation.
- Empowered the Social Justice Committee to research ways to use our Fellowship Hall to support our unhoused neighbors.
- Agreed to monitor correct mask use in our building.
- Authorized Kathy Ann Show and Michaela Loisel to review our church bylaws.
- Accepted names for a five-member writing team to create a congregational covenant.
- Heard reports from the Clerk, the Treasurer, the Finance Committee Chair, the President of the Board and the Minister.
