A Message from our Minister

Dear Members and Friends of UUCC,

Because we live in a body with an ego, it is natural for us to calculate our giving in terms of our love, our time, or our resources. Yet, if our giving initiates in our ego, we are less likely to experience blessings and transformation because we may experience depletion or loss. When our giving initiates from our hearts we are tapping into a universal reservoir of energy that does not come from our individual selves, but from the cosmos, the spirit of life, the quantum soup.

Giving can transform us if we see it as a spiritual practice. Perhaps this week we can each make a commitment to give something to someone every day for the pure satisfaction of giving. We can give our time or money to someone in need, we can give someone a smile or a hug or a compliment for no reason. We can give someone a gift: a flower, a candy bar, a book we have read, we can give to someone we love, someone we are challenged by, or someone we don't even know. We can notice as we give each day how we feel about ourselves, about the world. Dear Congregation:

This is to update you on the status of our professional ministry here at UUCC. Since our long-term minister, Reverend Carie Johnsen departed in 2020, after a 13-year ministry, we have been in an "interim period". We were served for one year by Interim Minister Chloe Briede who completed one year of a two-year ministry due to personal reasons. Rev. Christina Sillari was then contracted for this church year as a ½ time minister. The Board is currently assessing our ministerial needs for the next church year, and we will again be served by a contract minister as we move into our search for a Settled Minister beginning this June.

Reverend Christina came to us at a time of transition during which we are coming back together in community strong, determined and hopeful. We are fortunate to have her with us at this critical time as we ready ourselves for our Settled Minister in 2024.

So, within the next few weeks <u>you can expect a call</u> from one of your UUCC Board members to ask you to nominate one or more members of the congregation to serve on the critical Settled Minister Search Committee. We are looking for committee members who will represent the entire Congregation, have all our trust, develop a good process for the selection and be in good touch with the nature and the needs of our Congregation.

We thank you, in advance, for the time you can put into this and appreciate your continued commitment to the UUCC community. This is indeed one of the biggest and most significant acts of service a congregant can provide to our community.

Each year, the Finance Committee offers an educational, question and answer session on the church budgeting process; we call it Finance 101.

It will begin at 11:15am, directly after the morning worship service and is scheduled to last one hour. There will also be a second zoom session on Tuesday Feb 28th 5-6 PM. Stewardship Sunday will be March 5th.

This year's budget is largely influenced by four major items:

- 1. Salary increases for our staff
- 2. The cost of a settled minister search
- 3. The cost of hiring a 3/4 time minister for the coming year
- 4. Increased utilities cost in the coming year.

Plan to attend to find out more about the budget process before we adopt a budget at the annual meeting. We will be discussing the proposed draft budget for the 2023-2024 fiscal year.


Save your quart milk containers and any other small square plastic or coated cardboard containers - spring is on the way!

Saturday Breakfasts Report

The Social Justice Committee has provided breakfasts for guests of the Augusta Overnight Warming Shelter for 3 consecutive Saturdays. During these 3 weeks we fed 26, 23, and 33 unhoused individuals.

The work is accomplished by: a team of 15 UUCC member volunteers; volunteers from the Catholic Parish, Temple Beth El, South Parish Congregational Church, Vassalboro Quaker Meeting, as well as non-church affiliated community members; Individual financial contributions and food supplies from members of the UUCC and an Augusta community member; financial contributions from Vassalboro Quaker Meeting; and food contributions from Friends of the Vassalboro Quaker Meeting, the Augusta Foodbank, Pepperidge Farm Breads, UUCC members and members of the wider community.

The volunteers (with help from the guests) clean the kitchen, fellowship hall, hallways, and bathrooms. A guest shoveled and sanded both walkways; he was not asked, he saw the need and the shovel and did it.

Our guests express appreciation and gratitude. They eat heartily. We witness acts of beauty and generosity between the guests and volunteers and among the guests.



Mistakes & Miracles Discussion UPDATE



On January 22, thirteen congregation members met to discuss our reactions and learnings from the UUA Common Read <u>Mistakes and Miracles</u>. We focused on two questions:

- 1. How can we, at the corner of Winthrop and Summer St., become more inclusive and truly create "Beloved Community" within the congregation and into the wider community?
- 2. How and where do we start to move towards our goal of "Beloved Community"?

As you may imagine, the sharing of reactions to the book and the ideas for moving forward were wide-ranging and very thoughtful. We did not arrive at "the answers", but with many possibilities for exploration and action.

We will be inviting the congregation to a follow-up meeting (no need to read the book first, but there are copies available for loan if you are interested.) More information on the follow-up meeting will be in the next E-Blast.

Board of Trustees

From the Board President:

Last week, the Board approved the continuation of the Saturday Breakfast Program for people who stay at the Homeless Shelter at South Parish Community Church. I am proud of our community for providing this much-needed service of a warm breakfast every Saturday through the end of April. During one of our monthly (after service) Sharing Cafes, members of one group spoke of wanting our congregation to do something meaningful for our church neighborhood- acting on our UU Principles. Within what seemed like days, the idea to launch this breakfast at UUCC was taking shape. It took one determined person to start the conversation and it took off.

I will admit to some complicated feelings around people who are unhoused. It is possible that it brings up fear and guilt in me. My mother was homeless a few times in my adult life. Homelessness makes me uncomfortable. Perhaps it does so for others as well. And it should make us uncomfortable.

So, this past Saturday, I attended the Breakfast to see firsthand how it worked - and to help if my help was needed. Volunteers were plentiful- the Fellowship Hall became a place of respite with a hearty, home-cooked breakfast and perhaps a momentary sense of community?

It took me a while to get the courage (why, I don't know) to ask if I could join a couple of women as they were having breakfast. One of the women was very open to chatting with me and within minutes we had discovered

that we shared very fond memories of the same woman- one of my closest friends who died a few years ago. We teared up as we arrived at this significant realization. We were connecting woman to woman- heart to heart, having a meaningful, unexpected, and delightful conversation.

These Saturday Breakfasts are causing a ripple effect within our community. I imagine that every single volunteer has their own wondrous experience that is an opportunity for growth and delight. The people we are feeding are feeding our community in unexpected ways. Finding the gifts in this program of outreach makes me wonder about what else might this community do? Let's stay open to becoming the community we want to be.
