

Let me tell you why I come to church. I come to church—and would whether I was a preacher or not—because I fall below my own standards and need to be constantly brought back to them. It is not enough that I should think about the world and its problems at the level of a newspaper report or a magazine discussion. It could too soon become too low a level. I must have my conscience sharpened—sharpened until it goads me to the most thorough and responsible thinking of which I am capable. I must feel again the love I owe my fellow men (and women). I must not only hear about it but feel it. In church, I do.

I need to be reminded that there are things I must do in the world—unselfish things, things undertaken at the level of idealism. Workaday enthusiasms are not enough. They wear out

too soon. I want to experience human nature at its best—and be reminded of its highest possibilities, and this happens to me in church. It may seem as though the same things could be found in solitude, but it does not easily happen so.

In a congregation we share each other's spiritual needs and reinforce each other. In some ways, the soul is never lonelier than in a church service. That is certainly true of a pulpit, for a pulpit is the most intimately lonely place in the world—yet it is a loneliness that has strength in it. Perhaps this is because the innermost solitude of the human heart is in some paradoxical way a thing that can be shared, that must be shared, if the spirit of God is to find a full entrance into it.

We meet each other as friends and neighbors anywhere and everywhere, but we seldom do so in the consciousness of our souls' deepest yearnings. But in church we do—in a way that protects us from all that is intrusive yet leaves us knowing that we all have the same yearning, the same spiritual loneliness, the same need of assurance and faith and hope. We are brought together at the highest level possible. We are not merely an audience; we are a congregation.

I doubt whether I could stand the thought of the cruelty and misery of the present world unless I could know, through an experience that renewed itself over and over again, that at the heart of life there is assurance, that I can hold an ultimate belief that all is well. And this happens in church.

Life must have its sacred moments and its holy places. The soul will always seek its nurture. For religious experience—which is life at its most intense, life at its best—is something we cannot do without.

## 2) A silent auction will be held in the Fellowship Hall before and after church on April 2nd.



# **Observations** from Afar - Don Naber

I am proud to be a member of UUCC. My feelings have been strengthened with the Saturday breakfast program and especially so when the church was kept open during last Saturday's storm for those who needed shelter from the weather. Since it began in February, people have come forward with food, with funds and with labor to make it successful. Efforts like this spark interest and participation in a church and meet a local community need. A little personal history seems in order.

There is a well-funded and effective homeless shelter in Waterville. It began humbly as an effort by the Waterville UU church to provide overnight accommodation in a local motel to the unhoused. After a short time part of a rental property was secured for lodging and an evening meal was provided for guests. Police from Augusta, Belfast and Pittsfield would occasionally drop off those needing care. As outside groups participated in staffing, including Colby College and other churches, the Interfaith Shelter became true to its name. It soon acquired and expanded into the entire building and began to offer social services on site.

When the need to provide an evening meal for those in the area was identified the UU church started the Evening Sandwich Program. Initially it ran two late afternoons a week from the downstairs kitchen of the UU church. Donations, USDA Commodity Foods and expired breadstuffs, desert pastries and other foods were donated by local grocery stores. Other church and civic groups used the kitchen to expand the program to five days a week. The location was perfect - right in the middle of town.

I've seen how community service projects can energize a church. I know there are other ideas for the service utilization of UUCC floating around out there. I've heard a few. I think (and hope) I may be seeing steps in this process at UUCC.
