





Social Justice Committee

Volunteers Needed: WindowDressers Community Build in Hallowell Nov 3-8

The nonprofit organization <u>WindowDressers</u> supports volunteers in constructing light-weight insulating window inserts for homes in their communities. Insert assembly occurs at barn-raising style Community Builds, a participatory model that ensures inserts are much less expensive than commercial products and are free for households that cannot afford to pay.

UUCC Members Hilary Neckles and Jeff Jannell are leading a Community Build Nov. 3-8 in partnership with the Capital Area New Mainers Project at the Hallowell Multicultural Center, 20 Union St., in Hallowell. The build will produce inserts for about 30 homes, including eight New Mainer families as well as others in Augusta experiencing financial hardship. Volunteers are needed for 4-hour shifts throughout the week to help assemble the inserts. Volunteers will be trained to perform a simple step in the assembly process and lunch is provided daily between shifts. Volunteer help is essential to keep inserts affordable or free, helps your neighbors stay warmer and lower heating costs, and is fun! Note from Social Justice Committee: Last month a person from the Augusta community came to church during the Sunday service and stayed for fellowship. The person began asking individual church attendees for money to secure housing. It was implied that the Social Justice Committee had sanctioned this solicitation.

Please know that the Social Justice Committee does not encourage anyone to attend church to ask for money for any reason. We'd like to help everyone be securely housed and heartily fed. However, it is beyond our ability to do so. Our choice as a church community is to provide a welcoming, reliable, and abundant breakfast each week. And with this, our awareness of the many unmet needs increases each week. It is painful to accept that we are not meeting many essential needs.

As we continue with this ministry, we recognize our own needs to be both generous and boundaried. Each of us finds our own balance. If this is a struggle for you, members of the Social Justice Committee are available for conversation.

Restoring Wabanaki History in Maine at the Ballot Box.

The Eighth Principle and Question 6 in the November Election

Maine <u>voters will soon be asked</u> whether they want to reverse an 1876 Constitutional amendment to omit sections of the Maine Constitution which articulate the Wabanaki treaty obligations assumed from Massachusetts when Maine became a state in 1820.

The separation agreement between the states mandated that Indigenous land agreements continue after Maine established its independence. As Maine grew and settlers wanted more land, these obligations to the tribes became limiting and costly. After the Civil War, Maine's leaders tried to repeal these provisions but quickly learned Massachusetts would not agree to the changes. Blocked from repeal, they turned instead to redaction, passing a Constitutional amendment to omit these sections (which remained in force) when copies of the Constitution was printed. The Maine Historical Society explains the details of this here.

Over the last decade, there have been growing calls to return the omitted passages when our Constitution is published. As you vote in this November's election, take a moment to reflect on the 8th Principle which calls us to act in an anti-racist manner as we work toward a loving and inclusive Beloved Community.
