#### UUCC covenant - Approved by the congregation at the annual meeting June 5, 2023

To manifest our Vision, implement our Mission, and increase our understanding and practice of our UU Principles, we, the congregation of the Unitarian Universalist Community Church of Augusta, Maine, covenant as follows.

  - Take responsibility for our own words and actions and explore differences openly, directly, and with compassion while assuming the good intentions of one another.
- Because we value our relationships with our greater community, we promise to: 2.
  - Model our UU Principles and Covenant in our relationships with the greater community.
  - Respond to the needs of our community and seek to engage with others in helping to make the greater Augusta area a safe and supportive place.
- Because we value the wisdom and power of Covenant, we promise to: 3.
  - Forgive ourselves and others when we do not live up to this Covenant and begin again in love.
  - Display and recite these promises to each other on a regular basis, exploring them in our hearts and minds, and refer to them when difficulties arise. Recognize that our Covenant may evolve as our community evolves.

Join us for a post-Valentine's Tea Dance and Italian Dinner on Saturday February 17th.





#### **Introducing the "UUCC Incident Report"**

This article is to introduce you to the UUCC Incident Report. You may well ask, "What's an incident report? Why do we need an incident report? Whose idea was this? What the heck is an incident anyway?"

Perhaps a little historical background is in order to make sense of all this. In October of 2022, a half dozen members of the congregation and our minister attended a daylong seminar entitled *Safeguarding our Houses of Worship* put on by the Federal & Maine Emergency Management Administrations (FEMA & MEMA). This group of people were asked to form a UUCC Safety Workgroup which continues to meet and look for ways to ensure the physical safety of our church and those who attend activities here.

One of the first things that the Safety group noted was that we had no way of keeping track of any events that disrupted our collective sense of safety. Everyone could recall events in the past that were concerning, but no one could clearly remember the specifics. We defined an incident as **any event that occurs on church property that is out of the ordinary and leaves you or others feeling uncomfortable or at risk.** These can include many things such as threatening or disruptive behavior, threats from outside directed at the church community or other credible threats.

We will maintain a clipboard with blank Incident Reports in both the Sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall. We invite any attendee at church activities to use the form to document their observations and concerns about perceived incidents, please provide as much detail as possible. The completed form should be given to the minister, a worship associate or folded and placed in the pulpit in the Sanctuary. These forms will be collected by the church administrator and maintained in a secure file in the office to protect confidentiality. They will be reviewed by the chairperson of the Safety Committee at regular intervals and any concerning patterns will be reported to the Board of Trusties.

By documenting any and all such occurrences it will be possible for us to recognize any patterns and make data informed decisions about how best to provide effective communal security while respecting individual rights.
