

MUUSAN Team updates: Week of Feb 5, 2024

From the Wanbanaki Sovereignty Ally Team (WSAT):

• Priority Bill: LD 2007 - An Act to Advance Self-determination for Wabanaki Nations

The Chiefs decided to "go all out" on LD 2007 and include ALL 22 Task Force recommendations, even gaming. The resulting bill will be very similar to LD 1626 in the 130th legislature, though the language has not yet been printed.

• The WSAT will hold a **testimony writing workshop following their monthly meeting on Monday,** February 12th from 6-7 and 7-8 PM in the MUUSAN Zoom room. Everyone is welcome to attend!

From the Climate Action Team:

- Priority Bill: LD 2007, An Act Regarding Customer Costs and the Environmental and Health Effects of Natural Gas
 - o Here is a link to a fact sheet created by the Maine Environmental Priorities Coalition.
 - Contact members of the Energy, Utilities and Technology Committee to voice your support.
