



A reflection on Lectio Divina...

Friends.

I want to share with you an experience of deep spiritual engagement that I have found by joining Rev. Donna and Lori Millner Tuesday mornings for the Lectio Divina practice. I provide this testimony as a way to encourage any other church member or friend who might seek to both find space for quiet contemplation but also build community to give it a try.

I had been in church leadership for seven years. I told Rev. Donna that after all that time I felt as if I was floating above the true church and had forgotten how to live my UU faith. In addition to Sunday worship, which really does nurture me for the week, the Lectio Divina practice draws me into a deeper, meditative form of worship which allows me to explore my intimate personal needs and reflections, while at the same time realizing the kindness and joy of those I am sharing the process with.

Briefly, the process begins with a chalice lighting and reading. We then move into a mediation at which time we are offered the opportunity to put all of our thoughts in our imaginary bowl and to hold them without judgement. What a gift! As we come back, we enter into a deep and meaningful check-in. The heart of the process revolves around a reading, either a poem or a short piece of prose, chosen by Rev. Donna or Lori. We are allowed 15 glorious minutes to reflect on the words, to journal, draw, move in response to them, or to simply be with them. After 15 minutes, we share our reflections, without interruption. I am fascinated by how rich and different the responses have been. We close with words to extinguish our chalice.

All are welcome. We meet on zoom making it very accessible and if you are interested in discussing my experience further, I would love to do so.
