Local Climate Action Invitation & Opportunity

Support Divest Maine!

We have been invited to join with the Waterville UU Church to protest the state of Maine's investing in massive fossil fuel projects. This is likely our best local opportunity to make a difference and reduce climate change.

For the past 3 months, five members of the Waterville UU church have protested outside the Maine PERS building in Augusta. Maine PERS handles the pension plan for all Maine State employees. They protest on the second Thursday of the month, when the trustees are arriving for their monthly meeting. This has been an enjoyable, time, standing together with friendly people, holding signs, demonstrating respectfully for an hour.

Divest Maine is a coalition of climate activists from various groups, who are pushing Maine PERS to divest from fossil fuel holdings. The Maine State Legislature passed a law in 2001 stating that Maine PERS must divest, but Maine PERS has decided not to obey this law. This means that retirement money for Maine employees is funding new fossil fuel infrastructure projects around the country. Once these projects are completed, the fossil fuel industry will want to use them for at least twenty years, to get their investment back. Unfortunately, we only have about five years to stop using fossil fuels, if we want to avoid terrible impacts.

There are two simple steps you could take to support this effort. The second way you can support divestment is to join the next demonstration on **Thursday, 7/11 from 11:00 - 1:00 PM at 139 Capitol Street Augusta.**
