Getting to Know Dementia: Community Training Positive Approach to Care® Dementia Awareness in Bite-Sized Pieces (Four Saturday sessions). The sessions will be Oct 12th, Oct 19th, Nov. 2nd and Nov 9th 2024 from 11:00 am – 1:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall

Participants will start to appreciate what happens when a brain is changing due to some form of dementia, versus other factors, such as normal aging or a high-stress lifestyle. By learning about brain function and changes during dementia, we can begin to understand not only what is lost, but what is retained, to effectively provide that just right support.

Participants will be introduced to the GEMS® State model of the progression of dementia and learn how we can adapt our approach to create positive relationships. The concept of using visual, verbal, and touch cues to approach and connect with a person living in any state of dementia through the Positive Physical ApproachTM will be demonstrated and practiced.

We will learn about how we, as care partners, can become advocates for people, as relationships and tasks of daily living are impacted.

The Covenant Engagement Team (CET): Exploring Deep Listening

In October we will highlight the promise to: "Listen to each other with intention and curiosity and respond thoughtfully." What does it mean to listen "with intention"? How is that different from listening "with curiosity"? When and how does one "respond thoughtfully"?

I started this month's exploration reviewing what Leah Boyd taught us in February 2023 about the Non-Violent Communication (NVC) way of empathetic listening. It was good to remember what "just listening" felt like. Still, I wanted more guidance. So I turned to Oren Jay Sofer's book: "Say What You Mean: A Mindful Approach to Non-Violent Communication".

Listen with intention: In Part I of his book, Sofer talks about being present as a way to enhance listening. One exercise he offers: try to notice or be aware of the moment in which you decide either to speak or to listen. What is it like to just listen? When the urge to interrupt arises, try using this reminder: "WAIT" – which stands for "Why am I talking?"

Listen with curiosity: When I first read this part of the promise, I thought it meant to ask probing or meaningful questions, something with which I am not always comfortable. But on further reflection, I am starting to see this "curiosity" as what Sofer describes in Part II as an intention to enter into each conversation to learn something, to understand better, and to build relationships.

Volunteers Needed: WindowDressers Community Build in Hallowell October 22 - 27

WindowDressers is a nonprofit organization that supports volunteers in constructing lightweight insulating window inserts for homes in their communities. Insert assembly occurs at barn-raising style Community Builds, a participatory model that ensures inserts are much less expensive than commercial products and are free for households that cannot afford to pay.

UUCC Members Hilary Neckles and Jeff Jannell are leading a Community Build October 22-27 in partnership with the Capital Area New Mainers Project at the Hallowell Multicultural Center, 20 Union St., in Hallowell. **The build will produce inserts for about 39 homes,** including the church's "Judd House" and nine New Mainer families and others in Augusta experiencing financial hardship.

Volunteers are needed for 4-hour shifts throughout the week to help assemble the inserts. There are weekday, weekend, and evening shifts available. No experience is necessary -- volunteers will be taught to perform a simple step in the assembly process. Lunch is provided for all to enjoy together between shifts. Volunteer help is essential to keep inserts affordable or free, helps your neighbors stay warmer and lower heating costs, and is fun!
