



The <u>United Community Living Center</u> is applying to the City of Augusta for a conditional use permit to open a day time community center for our unhoused neighbors. The community center will provide assistance with applications for housing, jobs, school, and services; medical, first aid, mental health and substance abuse services; and lockers, showers and laundry. It will also serve as a warming center during cold weather and a cooling center during hot weather.

The Augusta Planning Board will be hearing the request for the conditional use permit on December 10, 6 PM at Augusta City Hall.
