\*More about "Dream" by John Cage: John Cage had already gained a reputation as a leading figure of the avant-garde -- largely for his development of the prepared piano -- when he wrote Dream in 1948. This was near the end of a period during which Cage wrote prolifically for modern dancers; Dream, in fact, was composed at the request of Cage's longtime collaborator, dancer/choreographer Merce Cunningham. As was his usual practice, Cage began work on Dream only after the dance was completely planned and Cunningham had given him a list of the metric patterns for each dance as a template from which Cage could proceed.

The music consists of groups of pitches that are allowed to resonate (either by holding the keys down or by using the sustaining pedal); the degree of resonance of the performing instrument determines the rhythmic flow of the piece. Foreshadowing later developments in Cage's aesthetic, Dream creates for the listener an otherworldly sense of time suspension. It is a gentle, slightly haiku-like work.





#### At the October Meeting the UUCC Board:

## Dr. Don on Covid-19

A few days ago Martha mentioned a problem common to teaching and present in these articles - the use of unexplained or undefined terms. As a partial remedy here are some of the terms we hear frequently but that often go unexplained.

We often hear the term "germ" used when discussing microorganisms, organisms that cannot be seen without magnification, however the word "germ" is not used in the science of microbiology. Its use is confined to the discussion of cells that develop into tissues such as wheat germ which is the embryo plant or cells in an embryo that develop into an organ or structure. In the general public "germ" springs from its use in the early 19th century to describe the then invisible agents of disease. The most commonly discussed of the several microscopic families of this group are bacteria and viruses.

Bacteria like "Streps", "Staph" and Salmonella are individual single cell organisms capable of growth and rapid reproduction in suitable conditions like those found in water, soil and living organisms like us. Viruses are quite different, consisting of a strand of genetic information surrounded by a cover. They are simple in structure, not able to carry out any function on their own and fully inactive until they attach to and enter the cells of a suitable host. Viruses infect everything from strawberries and tobacco to animals and us and they are a tiny fraction of the size of bacteria. (More on these size differences when I talk about HEPA filters in the future.) Once inside the host cells virus genetic information takes over the cell and causes it to build and then release hundreds of new viruses which spread the infection to more cells and eventually to more individuals. When an infection is spread between individuals it is considered to be communicable (or transmissible or infectious). The disease is termed virulent if it is both communicable and destructive, damaging host tissues perhaps even to the point of death. Many communicable diseases including COVID-19 are spread by those who are asymptomatic in the early stages of infection or "chronic carriers" who are infected and show either minor symptoms or no ill effects at all but still spread the disease.

Common antibiotics like penicillin and streptomycin have no value in combating viral infections. They are either the products of other microorganisms or chemical derivatives of these products designed to stop or hinder free-living bacteria from reproducing. Because viruses are true parasites acting within our own cells they are unharmed by antibiotic effects. To prevent virus infection we depend on immunity, the powerful actions of our complex immune system. As we have seen often in the past with other diseases, the best way to create immunity is with a vaccine. Vaccines stimulate the cells of the immune system to produce both antibodies, protein molecules specific for inactivating the virus and white blood cells to recognize and eliminate cells already infected. Once stimulated in this way the immune system will usually remember how to defeat the infection quickly should it return again. (Vaccines will be a future topic.)
