



COVID-19 Advisory Group update: On 10/10/2020 the Covid Advisory Group discussed feasibility of any increased group meetings in the church. At this time, we have not recommended increased usage of the church for more than 2-3 people for very specific things and those that were already approved. There are some requests still being discussed but we are waiting for additional information.

Although Maine's Covid numbers are lower than the rest of the nation, ventilation and the need for good air exchange is extremely important. Events held at indoor venues are much higher risk than events held outdoors. Vocalization (such as a lot of talking) is another consideration. Our building is not modern and air exchange is poor. The ad hoc group does want people to understand that recommendations to the board may change as time goes on and we monitor Covid presence in Kennebec county. It is anticipated there will be another wave of coronavirus. Maintaining safety is of the utmost importance.

Board Highlights – October 2020

At the October Meeting the UUCC Board:

Voted to accept the Financial Policies and Procedures dated September 4, 2020 with gratitude for the tremendous effort that went into the creation of this important document.

Heard that the COVID Advisory Group will continue to provide access to the building on a case by case basis and that most participants in the recent meeting expressed caution regarding re-opening buildings.

Accepted Gary Chapin's resignation as Chair of the Worship Committee (with gratitude for his volunteer service in this capacity) and welcomed Susan Burnett into that position.

Welcomed Cheryl Ring and Liza Gottlieb's willingness to join a working group to develop a list of transitional job responsibilities for the Coordinator of Lifespan Education for FY 20-21, update the personnel handbook and develop a job description for the new position (formerly Director of Religious Exploration).

Endorsed the letter to the congregation from the Committee on Ministry.

Postponed further planned agenda items until the November meeting.

Dr. Don on Covid-19

Face shields are a routine part of the protective equipment used by medical workers in COVID clinics for protection of the eyes, a route this virus can use to infect the body. As you have seen, some clinics go further to protect staff members with full "barrier" PPE (personal protective equipment) involving head covering hoods and body covering disposable suits.

But what about face shield use by the public? You and I have seen face shields being used in place of a mask and questions enter our minds. Here is what some officials are saying. Charles Bailey, MD, medical director for infection prevention at St. Joseph Hospital and Mission Hospital in Orange County, California states "A face shield shouldn't be the preferred form of PPE for people in public places." Infectious disease specialist Bruce Polsky, MD, chairman of medicine at NYU Winthrop Hospital, further notes "The point of a face shield is to provide an extra layer of protection and to protect the eyes when in close contact with someone that has—or is suspected to have—COVID-19."

Face shields do have advantages as other researchers note, they're easier to clean (you can wipe it down with a household disinfectant), reusable, and tend to be more durable and long-lasting. But Dr. Bailey says face shields are more challenging to wear for a variety of reasons, such as vision distortion and the potential to become fogged, and so should only be used when it's necessary to add eye protection and to shield masks from potential contamination. Most importantly, face shields do not provide as complete a barrier to block respiratory secretion aerosols when compared to a mask. A mask creates a complete or near-complete barrier on the sides of the wearer's face, while a shield is open on the sides, which allows small particles and aerosols to enter.

How you choose to protect yourself and others is entirely up to you. At this point, unless you wear it with a mask, it seems better to leave face shields to frontline workers who come into close contact with people infected with the coronavirus.
