



**COVID-19 Advisory Group update:** On 10/10/2020 the Covid Advisory Group discussed feasibility of any increased group meetings in the church. At this time, we have not recommended increased usage of the church for more than 2-3 people for very specific things and those that were already approved. There are some requests still being discussed but we are waiting for additional information.

Although Maine's Covid numbers are lower than the rest of the nation, ventilation and the need for good air exchange is extremely important. Events held at indoor venues are much higher risk than events held outdoors. Vocalization (such as a lot of talking) is another consideration. Our building is not modern and air exchange is poor. The ad hoc group does want people to understand that recommendations to the board may change as time goes on and we monitor Covid presence in Kennebec county. It is anticipated there will be another wave of coronavirus. Maintaining safety is of the utmost importance.

## Dr. Don on Covid-19

This article was prepared in response to a request.

HEPA (High-Efficiency Particulate) filters.

A few weeks ago my dental office visit introduced me to a new, wheeled, boxy unit with an oversized vacuum cleaner hose. During my treatment the hose of this vacuum unit was placed near my face and with an obvious but not unpleasant level of noise suctioned air into its base. I later found that these units utilize multiple HEPA filters, UV-C light (more on UV in a future article) and other means to clean air. I was impressed with the safety the clinic was providing for its staff and me when I saw in the bright light the mist and droplets coming from my mouth being suctioned away.

To explain HEPA filters we need a little background on measurement and specifically as it pertains to microorganisms. Metric measurement is standard in the sciences and the basic metric unit of length is the meter, a bit over 39 inches in length. A thousandth of a meter, a millimeter, is that tiniest division you see on the metric side of a ruler. A millimeter is divided into a thousand units, or micrometers, often called microns. Human hair averages 100 microns or a tenth of a millimeter in width. Typical bacteria measure a very few microns. Viruses are even smaller and are measured in nanometers, a thousandth of a micrometer. A single COVID-19 virus measures 90 to 120 nanometers. Enough! On to filters!

HEPA filters function differently than the paper filters we associate with coffee makers or many vacuum cleaner bags. Instead of having pores that prevent large particles from passing through, HEPA filters use a mat of microscopically thin fiberglass fibers that are treated with sticky chemical adhesives. To qualify as a HEPA filter 99.9 percent of particles measuring 0.3 microns (or 300 nanometers) must be removed, which would seem to allow COVID through since it is much smaller, but this is not the case. It is the adhesive nature of the fibers that prevents virtually all of the small, easily attached viruses from moving through.

So could a small, portable HEPA filter unit clear a meeting room of virus that doesn't have a centralized air filtered cooling or heating system? Probably not. While they remove virus from the air entering them with great efficiency, the rate at which they clear the air in large rooms is far too slow to be helpful. Those who are aware of the limitations of portable HEPA air filters are quick to say that the problem is that released virus never gets to the filter. It spreads to the people in the room instead.
