



Permission is never assumed."

We sincerely regret this mistake and we apologize for the impact on those of you who have experienced negative reactions to the email messages that followed. The church office is unable to stop the misuse of the email list since so many have received it. It is the personal responsibility of each member to decide whether they are going to honor the policy and respect the implied boundary.

Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19 COVID 19 Medication: Part 1

Having activist leanings, I couldn't help but notice the protest group in downtown Belfast last Sunday. A good sized gathering, energetic and loud was waving "No Masks for ME" signs. I found myself deeply troubled by my perceptions of the danger of misinformation and resolved to discuss how science and medicine have been portrayed by the information industry, politics and leadership at a later time. Right now it is time for reliable information, the antidote to misinformation.

Over a quarter of a million people have died from COVID-19 in the U.S., and that number continues to grow at an increasing rate. The healthcare system in Maine is showing the strain. Elsewhere the situation is becoming desperate. Scientists around the world are seeking safe and effective treatments for COVID-19 and in this first of two parts I'll present the most important of what I have learned.

Fortunately, most people who become ill with COVID-19 will be able to recover at home. Current treatment for mild to moderate COVID-19 symptoms may include supportive care such as hydration (IV fluids), pain and fever control, and breathing treatments. Sometimes antibiotics are used to treat concurrent bacterial infections. Patients with more severe symptoms are typically admitted to the hospital and treated with various medications to slow the progression of the disease and relieve symptoms. Some patients need supplementary oxygen and mechanical ventilatory support. Techniques such as proning (having patients lay on their stomach), heparin for those experiencing blood clots and anti-inflammatory corticosteroids such as dexamethasone, have helped patients recover quicker.

A recent clinical trial report showed dexamethasone decreased the risk of dying in very ill COVID-19 patients. Physicians have been treating very ill COVID-19 patients with corticosteroids since the pandemic began. In those patients who develop a hyper-immune inflammatory response to the viral infection, it is their immune system's overreaction that damages the lungs and other organs, often leading to death.

Dexamethasone and other corticosteroids (prednisone, methylprednisolone) are potent, effective anti-inflammatory drugs. They are readily available and inexpensive, but when are they most beneficial? If used too soon they blunt the body's natural defense system, allowing the virus to thrive. Studies suggest using these drugs as the virus levels in the body are in decline, but before the immune system attacks healthy tissues. Studies show the greatest benefit is seen in the most severely ill.

More on antibody containing medications, and FDA approved antivirals next time.
