



## Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19

**COVID 19 Mutations** 

We have begun to hear about COVID mutations recently so I wanted to discuss this now. I will get back to how vaccines work to create immunity next time.

A mutation is a change in an organism's genetics which leads to evolution. Mutations are so common that our cells have mechanisms to prevent them most of the time. The simpler structure and genetics of most viruses, and especially those like COVID-19, lack these controls and as a result mutations are frequent. Many of the mutations that occur are so destructive that the virus in which they occur fails to reproduce and is thus eliminated. Other mutations cause a virus to be more successful in reproduction and these spread more quickly. This is what is being reported currently.

I will back up for a moment and share information with you from the New York Times. It is thought that a mutation to an already known common Corona virus may have led to the COVID-19 pandemic. It is a mutation called 614G and "...the subtle change in the virus's genome appears to have had a big ripple effect", said David Engelthaler, a geneticist at the Translational Genomics Research Institute in Arizona. The first outbreaks of the virus would have spread around the world even without the mutation, believe most researchers, including Engelthaler. The original variant spotted in Wuhan, China in late 2019 was already highly contagious, he said but the mutation appears to have made the pandemic spread farther and faster than it would have without it.

Recently a more contagious coronavirus variant known as B.1.1.7 was identified in the United Kingdom and has now been seen in at least four U.S. states and 33 countries. We should expect it to show up widely in the U.S. Several nations have also identified an additional variant, B.1.351, first identified in South Africa, also appears to infect people more easily. A third variant has been detected in Nigeria. We may see these and other COVID mutations in the U.S.

The B.1.1.7. U.K. variant has several mutations that affect the "spike protein" on the virus surface that attaches to human cells. "It's able to bind to the receptors on cells better, and therefore is transmitted better," said Dr. Anthony Fauci, the nation's leading infectious disease expert. There is no evidence that B.1.1.7 causes more severe illness or increased risk of death, according to the CDC, and importantly, current COVID-19 vaccines protect against B.1.1.7.

"From what we know from experience with this mutation and other mutations, it's unlikely to have a large impact on vaccine-induced immunity, or existing immunity from previous strains," said Dr. Greg Armstrong, director of the CDC's Office of Advanced Molecular Detection. Current treatment options also seem to be little impacted by these viral genetic changes. But ... "because the variants spread more rapidly, they could lead to more cases and put even more strain on our heavily burdened health care systems," said Dr. Henry Walke, incident manager for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's COVID-19 response. "We need to be even more vigilant in our prevention measures to slow the spread of COVID-19."
