



Message / Invitation from the Board of Trustees – General Assembly

For those who might be interested, it is time to start thinking of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA)'s General Assembly, June 23-27, 2021. Organically to be held in Milwaukee WI, the event will be held virtually again this year. The UUA states "General Assembly is the annual gathering of Unitarian Universalists, where we conduct business of the Association, explore the theological underpinnings of our faith, and lean fully into our mission and principles. That remains true even when we cannot gather physically. Last year, GA had more than 4,900 registered attendees participate from remote locations around the world. Although we give up the face-to-face interaction and hugs that are prevalent when we meet in-person, we retain our dedication to community and make our experience more accessible and more environmentally sustainable."

Dr. Don on COVID-19 The J&J vaccine "pause"

A blood clot is a mass of cell fragments called platelets, blood cells and proteins that gather to stop excessive bleeding. In most cases, blood clots are healthy and the body dissolves them naturally once the injury has healed. However, there are a variety of conditions that cause them to form unnecessarily or to not dissolve naturally.

Recently very rare cases of blood clot formation have been seen in women under 50, and one man in his 30's who all received the Johnson and Johnson vaccine a week or two earlier. In an unusual combination many of these individuals had low platelet counts which typically causes problems forming clots so ongoing bleeding results. Additionally in an unusual phenomenon, clots formed in serious places like the lungs, legs, abdomen, or brain, where potentially deadly stroke-like symptoms can occur. Use of the vaccine was paused for almost two weeks while the clotting cases were investigated. A similar pattern of clots has been observed in a tiny percentage of people who received the AstraZeneca vaccine in Europe.

Dr. Anne Schuchat, Principal Deputy Director of the CDC and Dr. Peter Marks, director of the FDA's Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research stated that those who received the J&J vaccine and develop severe headache, abdominal pain, leg pain, or shortness of breath within three weeks after vaccination should contact their health care provider. It was also stressed that people should not be concerned about mild headaches and flu-like symptoms following vaccination. These are common, harmless side effects of the immune system's defense against the coronavirus.

Following detailed study of these rare reactions the CDC and FDA ended the pause, allowing the vaccine's use to resume. They also recommended that the Food and Drug Administration add a warning about the rare risk of blood clots in some people. At the moment medical science is not sure what is causing this exceedingly rare reaction to the vaccine. As we will read next time despite the small number of cases, there are strong theories pointing to their cause and that medicine quickly realized treatment of these rare vaccine-related blood clots requires alternatives to the medications commonly used to treat strokes and other blood vessel blocking clots.
