



For those who might be interested, it is time to start thinking of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA)'s General Assembly, June 23-27, 2021. Organically to be held in Milwaukee WI, the event will be held virtually again this year. The UUA states "General Assembly is the annual gathering of Unitarian Universalists, where we conduct business of the Association, explore the theological underpinnings of our faith, and lean fully into our mission and principles. That remains true even when we cannot gather physically. Last year, GA had more than 4,900 registered attendees participate from remote locations around the world. Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19 Rare Vaccine Blood Clots

Evidence is building that an uncommon immune response is behind dangerous, but incredibly rare, blood clots associated with the Johnson & Johnson and AstraZeneca vaccines. But the good news is there is a test to identify it and provide patients the right care.

Studies suggest that some inoculated people develop an immune response that attacks a protein called platelet factor 4 or PF4, which makes platelets form clots. As a result platelets are used up before the body can make more and patients wind up with both the rare clots and bleeding due to the low levels of blood platelets.

Research reported in the New England Journal of Medicine showed that of 23 patients who received the Astra-Zeneca's vaccine and had symptoms of clots or low platelets, 21 tested positive for antibodies to PF4. Of those, 20 people developed blood clots. This finding confirmed previous studies.

Most of the women who had clots after receiving Johnson & Johnson's shot in the U.S. also had PF4 antibodies, reported the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. This advisory group led to the Food and Drug Administration's temporary pause on administering the J&J vaccine. The FDA didn't recommend the pause "because we felt that the number of cases was growing out of control, but because we wanted to educate providers to know what to do," said Peter Marks, MD, PhD, director of the FDA's Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research, during an AMA-hosted webinar.

"Because we are aware of this syndrome... we know how to treat it," says Jean Connors, a clinical hematologist at Harvard Medical School and Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston who was not involved in the studies. And unlike the people who developed the clots before officials pinpointed the link, "we can diagnose it faster and treat it more appropriately if it does happen, so that the outcomes will be better."

As Dr. Mark Crowther, a member of the American Society of Hematology said "Covid-19 [infection] is associated with a risk of blood clots that is thousands of times higher" than blood clots possibly caused by any vaccine. "it's important people not miss that."

My experience at the Fryeberg mobile vaccination clinic suggests that with one exception people were pleased to receive the J&J vaccine. Several said the "one and done" aspect of the vaccine brought them to the clinic. Have you been vaccinated?
