





Faith Communities Rally around Democracy

In collaboration with the Maine Council of Churches and the Maine Episcopal Diocese, MUUSAN is inviting Unitarian Universalists throughout Maine to sign a petition from people of faith urging Senator King and Senator Collins to support S.1, the For the People Act.

Although MUUSAN usually focuses its efforts on state-level advocacy, we recognize that the success of all our social justice legislative advocacy depends upon a fair and inclusive democracy.

<u>S.1, The For the People Act</u>, empowers ordinary voters in every state by mandating same-day voter registration, restoring voting rights to people with prior convictions, ending partisan gerrymandering of congressional districts, reforming campaign finance, and more. Check out this <u>discussion of how The For the People Act</u> <u>ensures that democracy works for everyone</u> by the Brennan Center for Justice.

The House passed the **For the People Act** in March, so it is now in the hands of the Senate. Our Maine Senators need to hear from as many constituents as possible in support of this vital effort to enshrine and extend voting rights across our country!

Dr. Don on COVID-19 Maine Leads in Full Vaccinations

As of Monday Maine leads the country with 49.8 percent of its population fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Vermont leads the country with 65.7% of its population at least partially vaccinated against the virus. All the New England states (plus Hawaii) lead the nation in partial vaccination rates with Rhode Island the lowest of the leading group at over 57% partially vaccinated. Massachusetts is second in the nation with a 63.1% rate. Maine has a total of over 59.7% of the population at least partially vaccinated. Rates across the rest of the nation are lower, some substantially.

Maine CDC and the Department of Health and Human Services has implemented novel strategies to increase Maine vaccination rates. Examples include mobile vaccine clinics travelling the state, hiring drug stores to vaccinate, offering incentives that are meaningful to Mainers, expanding vaccination clinic hours and offering clinics at factories and businesses. Dr. Shah, Commissioner Lambrew and their staff members should be applauded for their innovation and pandemic responsiveness in helping Maine achieve its nation leading vaccination status.

According to the New York Times, using data from the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), at the bottom is Mississippi, where 32% of the population has received at least one vaccine dose. Similarly, every state bordering it has vaccinated less than 40% of its residents.

The reported contrast between states and regions largely fits along partisan political lines. States that voted Democratic in the most recent presidential election have higher vaccination rates than those that voted Republican. The 22 states with the highest percentage of vaccinated people all voted for President Joe Biden. Among the 17 states with the lowest vaccination rates, only Georgia went for Biden, according to the CDC.

Other demographic differences, including age, race and education, have similarly influenced vaccination rates. There are slight differences in state rankings depending on whether you look at those partially or fully vaccinated, or whether you compare total population, those older than 18 or those older than 65. Still, the overall demographic trends are clear, and they fit cleanly with America's politics and demographics.

The differences are largely because young people and Republicans have shown the highest levels of vaccine hesitancy, according to a CNN poll in late April. Further, those without a four-year college degree were more likely to say they will not seek out a vaccine, the CNN poll found. Racial demographics also play a role in the differences, as Black and Hispanic people have been vaccinated at rates lower than their percentage share of the population, according to CDC data. Health advocates and polling have indicated vaccine misinformation and a lack of access are the key reasons behind this difference.

The Times concludes that when you combine those trends you can understand why Vermont, and the New England states, have been so successful at vaccinations. Its population is older and more white, with more college graduates and more Democrats. Mississippi is at the opposite end. It is younger and less white, with fewer college graduates and more Republicans, according to Census data.

Board of Trustees

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS MAY 13, 2021

At its May 13 meeting, the UUCC Board:

- Heard from the Treasurer that we are 83% of the way through the fiscal year and that 88% of pledges have come in. Income is on track, expenses are lower than budgeted.
- Heard from the Finance Chair that we have received 55 pledges totaling \$129,135 to date toward the goal of \$165,000.
- Created a task force with members of the Board and COVID Advisory group to explore reopening the building using science, safety and ethics as guiding principles. Members are Don Naber, Betty Cairn, Harry Grimmnitz, Kevin Kane and Catherine Emery. They will hold congregational conversations and interview other organizations to collect best practices before making recommendations.
- Heard from the President that UUCC will make an offer to an interim minister candidate before the end of May. The UUA process was commended.
- Heard details of building renovations which are going well.
- Discussed the draft budget, which still shows a deficit. Therefore extra meetings have been scheduled to continue working through it to see how we might reduce expenses and increase income. The budget will be presented to the congregation for review at the annual meeting on Sunday, June 6th.
- At the close of business the Board presented Rev. Carie with a photo memory book and a card announcing the formation of the Rev. Carie Johnsen Social Justice Fund which has raised over \$15,000 to date (held in a fund at the Maine Community Foundation).
