



# Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19 Rare Vaccine Related Heart Problem Investigated

The CDC's vaccine safety group is looking into reports of heart problems occurring in young adults and teenagers who received the Pfizer and Moderna mRNA COVID-19 vaccines. In a May 17 meeting the group presented reports of the heart condition called myocarditis in a very small number of vaccinated teenagers and young adults. At the moment, the number of cases of myocarditis reported after vaccination does not appear to be greater than would normally be seen in young people, according to the CDC. Members of the vaccine safety group "felt that information about reports of myocarditis should be communicated to providers."

Myocarditis is an inflammation of the heart muscle that can occur due to COVID, seasonal flu and other infections, and the immune system chemicals released in defense of the body. Experts emphasized that the rare side effect paled in comparison to the potential risks of COVID. Earlier in Israel a small number of cases of the heart inflammation were reported in men under 30 receiving both injections of the mRNA vaccines.

The CDC review of the reports is in early stages and was sparse in details, saying only that there were "relatively few" cases and that they may be entirely unrelated to vaccination. The agency posted guidance on its website urging doctors and clinicians to be alert to unusual heart symptoms among young people who have just received their shots. "It's terrific that things are being transparent. … It shows the surveillance systems are working," said Dr. Lawrence Kleinman, professor and vice chair of the department of pediatrics at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School.

Dr. Celine Gounder, an infectious disease specialist at Bellevue Hospital Center in New York said "It may simply be a coincidence that some people are developing myocarditis after vaccination." The cases seem to have occurred predominantly in male adolescents and young adults about four days after their second dose of one of the mRNA vaccines. "Most cases appear to be mild, and follow-up of cases is ongoing," the vaccine safety group said. The CDC strongly recommends COVID vaccines for Americans ages 12 and older.

As of May 13, the coronavirus had infected more than 3.9 million children and sent more than 16,000 to hospitals, more than are hospitalized for flu in an average year, according to data collected by the American Academy of Pediatrics. About 300 children have died of COVID-19 in the United States, making it one of the top 10 causes of death in children since the pandemic began.

"And that's in the context of all the mitigation measures taken," said Dr. Jeremy Faust, an emergency medicine physician at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston.

In the general population, about 10 to 20 of every 100,000 people each year develop myocarditis, experiencing symptoms from fatigue and chest pain to arrhythmias and cardiac arrest. Many others likely have mild symptoms and are never diagnosed, according to researchers. A range of treatments are available depending on the severity of the disease.

# **Board of Trustees**

#### **BOARD HIGHLIGHTS MAY 13, 2021**

#### At its May 13 meeting, the UUCC Board:

- Heard from the Treasurer that we are 83% of the way through the fiscal year and that 88% of pledges have come in. Income is on track, expenses are lower than budgeted.
- Heard from the Finance Chair that we have received 55 pledges totaling \$129,135 to date toward the goal of \$165,000.
- Created a task force with members of the Board and COVID Advisory group to explore reopening the building using science, safety and ethics as guiding principles. Members are Don Naber, Betty Cairn, Harry Grimmnitz, Kevin Kane and Catherine Emery. They will hold congregational conversations and interview other organizations to collect best practices before making recommendations.
- Heard from the President that UUCC will make an offer to an interim minister candidate before the end of May. The UUA process was commended.
- Heard details of building renovations which are going well.
- Discussed the draft budget, which still shows a deficit. Therefore extra meetings have been scheduled to continue working through it to see how we might reduce expenses and increase income. The budget will be presented to the congregation for review at the annual meeting on Sunday, June 6<sup>th</sup>.
- At the close of business the Board presented Rev. Carie with a photo memory book and a card announcing the formation of the Rev. Carie Johnsen Social Justice Fund which has raised over \$15,000 to date (held in a fund at the Maine Community Foundation).
