



Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19 Using Dogs To Detect COVID-19 Infections

Although a bit out of the mainstream, the following caught my eye this past week, and now I see it has been picked up by numerous major publications.

A combined team from the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, the group Medical Detection Dogs, and Durham University ran a study training dogs to identify unique odors associated with coronavirus infection. Their study confirmed results previously seen showing dogs' ability to detect the infection.

As anyone who has walked a dog knows, dogs have an incredible sense of smell that eclipses our own abilities by orders of magnitude. The complex folded structure of their nasal cavity which results in a huge surface area is home to over 300 million scent receptors compared to 5 million in a human. This makes it ideal for detecting

odors and combined with their ability to learn, means dogs are great biosensors, capable of detecting odors associated with drugs, explosives, and food, which many of us have encountered at airports.

Medical Detection Dogs has more than 10 years of research experience in training bio detection dogs to detect changes in human odor caused by a variety of medical conditions. The group's recent work has demonstrated that the dogs' accuracy in detecting the odor of COVID infection is reliably at 90%. Remarkably, other studies have shown dogs can detect healthy individuals 100% of the time. Their research has also demonstrated that dogs can be trained to detect odor at dilutions of parts per trillion, which is the equivalent of one teaspoon of sugar in two Olympic sized swimming pools of water.

We have known for decades from work originally done in China that dogs can be trained to detect the presence of respiratory conditions such as lung cancer through changes in respiratory compounds emitted from patients. Recent research on flu viruses has shown that the viruses interact with the human immune system to create detectable changes in our exhaled respiratory odor profiles. Since dogs have already been shown to be able to detect the odors associated with other respiratory infections, researchers were correctly confident that dogs could do it for COVID-19.

While I'm not sure how well dogs would be accepted into the testing that western medicine depends upon for diagnosing COVID-19, I am sure dogs could easily be walked amongst school children or in large crowds to detect COVID infections.
