

Dr. Don on COVID-19 Missouri Requests Federal COVID Aid

A cautionary tale from a state that has dealt with COVID differently from Maine.

Missouri requested help from new COVID-19 federal response teams as the delta variant continues to spread, with surging case numbers and hospitalizations throughout the state. The response with what are called "surge response teams," announced in a White House press conference last Thursday, will be dispatched to emerging COVID-19 hotspots around the country, where vaccination rates remain low. The teams are designed to "surge additional testing into communities to expand detection of the virus and allow public health authorities to do contact tracing to help contain outbreaks," according to an announcement from the White House. They'll aim to boost testing and vaccinations, as well as track down and treat those who have fallen ill.

According to the Kansas City Star and multiple media reports, Missouri has requested this federal aid. In a recent report, the CDC says the highest proportion of Delta variant was detected in southwest Missouri, which accounted for nearly two-thirds of all Delta variants identified in the state. Missouri reported 4,271 new COVID-19 cases in the past week, and 945 people throughout the state are hospitalized. Of those hospitalized, 265 are in the intensive care unit and 121 are on ventilators, according to state data.

State data shows that 44.6% of residents have received at least one shot, far short of the 54.7% rate nationally. In more than 60 Missouri counties, less than 30% of the population had received their first shot, according to state data. Southwest Missouri emerged in recent weeks as a hotspot for the delta variant – a more infectious strain of COVID-19. The results have strained hospitals, made national headlines and frustrated health care leaders. Unfortunately hospitalizations jumped by nearly 30% just this past weekend, making the situation even worse.

Steve Edwards, president and CEO of CoxHealth in Springfield, Missouri posted the hospital's daily virus report — a 32% symptomatic positive case rate — alongside this message of frustration Thursday: "If you are making wildly disparaging comments about the vaccine, and have no public health expertise, you may be responsible for someone's death," Edwards wrote. "Shut up."

[As of July 6 the seven day averages in Maine for new COVID infections is 20 and new daily hospitalizations average 1. Maine and Massachusetts have 62% of their populations fully vaccinated, second in the U.S. only to Vermont with 66% fully vaccinated. Over 90% of those 65 and older in Maine are fully vaccinated. The state of Mississippi has the lowest vaccination rate at just under 30%.]
