

Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19 NEWS: Delta Variant Update, COVID Boosters, Olympics and Tennessee

Delta Variant Update: Over the past seven days in the U.S., new COVID-19 cases increased by 47.5% from the previous week, according to Johns Hopkins University data. That's averaging about 19,455 new infections a day. Hospitalizations are rising again. Deaths, a lagging indicator, also appear ready to start climbing. More than 99% of deaths are now among people who have not been vaccinated, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention reports.

Dr. Jennifer Nuzzo, with the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security, says two-thirds of counties with sustained increases in new infections are in states with low vaccine coverage. "But the fact that we are seeing case increases in counties even in higher vaccination states is worrisome," she tweeted. "Anywhere there are pockets of low vax coverage is at risk!" The highly contagious Delta variant now accounts for just over half the COVID-19 cases in the United States, according to the CDC.

COVID Boosters: Representatives from Pfizer and federal health officials, who sent out conflicting signals about the need for vaccine booster shots, are planning to meet this week. Pfizer said its booster shot strongly extends protection but U.S. officials want to see the data before recommending a third dose. Neither the companies nor the government recommend booster shots yet, and won't until their safety and effectiveness can be fully explored.

In a joint statement late Thursday, the FDA and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention emphasized that people who have been fully vaccinated do not need booster shots yet. "FDA, CDC, and NIH are engaged in a science-based, rigorous process to consider whether or when a booster might be necessary," according to the government statement. "We are prepared for booster doses if and when the science demonstrates that they are needed."

Olympics: There will be no fans at the Tokyo Olympics. Originally, 10,000 local fans were going to be admitted to Olympic events. Foreign fans were banned in March, and organizers repeatedly delayed a decision on whether to allow Japanese fans. The announcement Thursday followed the declaration of a new state of emergency, which took effect Monday, through the Olympics and beyond. "The priority will be to determine safe and secure Games," Tokyo 2020 president Seiko Hashimoto said at a news conference following a decision by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government, the government of Japan, the International Olympic Committee.

Tennessee: The Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) will halt all adolescent vaccine outreach – not just for coronavirus, but all diseases amid pressure from Republican state lawmakers, according to an internal report and agency emails. If the health department must issue any information about vaccines, staff are instructed to strip the agency logo off the documents. TDH will also stop all COVID-19 vaccine events on school property. The decisions to end vaccine outreach and school events come directly from Health Commissioner Dr. Lisa Piercey, the internal report states.

These changes to Tennessee's vaccination strategy, detailed in a TDH COVID-19 report illustrate how the state government continues to dial back efforts to vaccinate minors against coronavirus. This approach will also hamper the state's capacity to vaccinate adults and protect children from other infectious diseases. These

changes will take effect just as the coronavirus pandemic shows new signs of spread in Tennessee. After months of decline, the average number of new cases per day has more than doubled in the past two weeks. Tennessee lags behind most of the nation with only 38% of Tennesseans fully vaccinated.

Decisions to ratchet back outreach come amid pressure from conservative lawmakers, who have embraced misinformation about the coronavirus vaccine, said Dr. Michelle Fiscus, Tennessee's former top vaccine official. Fiscus was fired without explanation on Monday. Fiscus said she was scapegoated to appease lawmakers, who had described routine vaccine outreach as "reprehensible." The agency's outreach campaign recommended vaccination against flu, measles, mumps, rubella and human papillomavirus, or HPV, among others.
