

Board of Trustees

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS - August 2021

At its August 12, meeting, the Board:

- Heard from the treasurer that the updated figure for income from fy 20-21 is \$256,625 giving us a carryover for this year of \$24,463. The new payroll service is working smoothly.
- Heard from Rev. Claire Curole about her role as Community Minister with UUCC.
- Passed a motion to create a work group to make recommendations to the Board by February for upgrading the church technology and communication systems.
- Approved the reopening policy presented by the Covid team after discussion and some revision.

The next meeting of the Board will be SEPTEMBER 9, at 5:00.

Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19 Maine health care workers must be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 by October 1, 2021.

The Maine Center for Disease Control and Department of Health and Human Services has long required employees of health care facilities to be immunized against vaccine-preventable diseases, including measles, mumps, rubella, chickenpox, hepatitis B, and influenza. This existing rule has been amended to include the COVID-19 vaccine. Organizations that fall under the requirement must ensure each employee is vaccinated. The state will enforce it as a condition of the facilities' licensure.

Gov. Janet Mills' office says she believes Mainers have the right to expect their health care workers are fully vaccinated against COVID-19. The governor's office released a statement in response to a demonstration in Portland's West End Saturday where at least 200 people rallied against the mandate. Demonstrators also protested the requirement in Bangor and Augusta citing the vaccines as not fully CDC licensed, freedom to decide what enters their bodies and concern with vaccine side effects.

The new requirement "simply adds the COVID-19 vaccine and is supported by a broad coalition of health care providers across Maine," stated Lindsay Crete, spokesperson for Gov. Mills. "Further, the governor believes that every person in Maine who is placed in the care of a health care facility has the right to expect - as do their families - that they will receive high-quality and safe care, which includes having their care providers be fully vaccinated in order to protect them against this deadly virus as much as possible," Crete added.

The COVID-19 vaccine mandate is supported by the Maine Hospital Association and other groups representing dentists, nursing homes and others. The state's biggest hospital networks, MaineHealth and Northern Light Health, had already announced their own mandates, but wanted a statewide mandate to keep requirements uniform across the state.

Legislative Republicans are preparing legislation to try to repeal the mandate, although the chambers are out until October and Democratic majorities would make such a bill dead on arrival. Mills, her administration and health care providers are betting that it will not cause major harm to the health care sector.

Hospitals are preparing for resistance, but an exodus from the profession would be a surprise given recent examples like Houston Methodist Hospitals which lost 0.006 percent of their workforce after mandating COVID vaccinations. Both the hospital association and Northern Light said they expect at least a small share of the workforce to quit over the mandate. While the state boasts one of the highest vaccination rates in the country, it still has more than 10,000 workers in hospitals and nursing homes alone who are not fully vaccinated, according to state data.
