# **Seasoned Souls**





# Update from COVID-19 Advisory Group

The plan for reopening UUCC for in-person, indoor gatherings approved by the Board on August 12, 2021 depends on the COVID-19 pandemic being under control in our state and county. The Delta variant of the virus (now widely circulating in Maine) is primarily affecting unvaccinated individuals, but some fully vaccinated folks are being infected and a few are getting very sick despite immunization.

The Board adopted a Maine CDC metric that measures "community (person to person) transmission" of the virus. We are closely monitoring this metric for both our county and the entire state (since the virus does not pay attention to county lines on the map). We sought expert advice from an infectious disease specialist and have set an upper safe limit of 10 new cases of COVID-19 per 10,000 people based upon the 14 day average. *If either county or state are over 10, it is not safe for us to reopen*. This data is published by the Maine CDC every Thursday morning (see below for how to access this information for yourself).

### The most recent Maine CDC data: Published on September 9, 2021

The necessary CDC metric for us to reopen is no more than 10 new cases per 10,000 people.

The present CDC metric data means that there is currently too much COVID-19 activity for us to safely reopen.

- 5. We are using the 14 day "Case Data" (middle 4 columns) "Rate per 10,000" for Kennebec County and the total for the State.

### **Update on UUA and UUCC COVID-19 Recommendations**

The UUCC Board of Trustees, at their meeting on September 9, 2021 adopted the following recommendations of the UUCC COVID-19 Advisory Group regarding the UUA "Updated COVID Guidance for the Delta Variant" (please refer to this link for the full text of the UUA guidance: <a href="https://www.uua.org/pandemics/gathering-guidance">https://www.uua.org/pandemics/gathering-guidance</a>).

The COVID-19 Advisory Group met on September 1, 2021 and discussed the differences between the UUA'S guidance and the existing UUCC plans regarding indoor and outdoor gatherings given the current delta variant surge in Maine. Since most of the UUA guidance is identical to the reopening plan the Board adopted in August, 2021, we focused on four (4) areas of difference:

- 1. Physical distancing for indoor gatherings. The UUA is recommending 6 (six) feet of spacing rather than the three (3) feet in our August, 2021 plan for reopening the church to in person gatherings.
  - It is our recommendation that UUCC stay with the three (3) foot physical distance plan. Our reasoning is that we will not open the church for indoor, in person gatherings until community transmission of COVID-19 is below our metric of 10 new cases per 10,000 people. At that point, three feet of physical distancing for people wearing masks will be adequate to provide a safe environment for attendees.
- 2. Requiring masks for attendees at outdoor gatherings. The UUA is recommending that all attendees at outdoor gatherings resume wearing masks in addition to physical distancing. The UUCC guidelines for small groups meeting outdoors, adopted Spring 2021, allows attendees to meet without masks as long as they maintain six (6) feet of physical distance.
  - It is our recommendation that UUCC stay with our existing guideline not requiring masks outdoors. Our reasoning is that there is ample evidence of the safety of unmasked outdoor gatherings with six (6) feet of physical distancing of the attendees. Keeping in mind that some individuals may need greater protection and will wish to continue wearing a mask and their decision needs to be respected.
- 3. Requiring masks and 10-12 feet of physical distance between attendees for any outdoor singing. Singing has repeatedly been shown to be a "high risk activity", releasing a dramatically increased number of respiratory droplets and aerosols over a wider area compared to speaking. While there is very limited data regarding viral transmission singing outdoors, the existing data for indoor singing suggests that this recommendation is appropriate.

It is our recommendation that UUCC adopt this guideline for outdoor singing.

4. **Ventilation of indoor space**. The UUA guidance repeatedly mentions the need for "good" or "excellent" ventilation of indoor spaces for safe gatherings. Adequate ventilation removes airborne respiratory droplets and aerosols from the air reducing the chances of disease transmission. While COVID-19 is our current respiratory disease of concern, it will not be the last time we are confronted with this situation.

It is our recommendation that UUCC undertake a study of the feasibility and cost of retrofitting our church building with an appropriate ventilation system.

# Dr. Don on Covid-19

The Continuing Pandemic Dr. Don on COVID-19

The group of viruses that includes the SARS variant we now call COVID-19 has long been known for its capacity to mutate and change into what are commonly known now as variants. This calls to mind what lies ahead for this pandemic and the short uncomfortable truth I see is that we should not expect it to end soon. The following is taken from article I read last week from Bloomberg News making my point but through the words and observations of a world class expert.

"I see these continued surges occurring throughout the world," said Michael Osterholm, director of the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, and an adviser to U.S. President Joe Biden. "Then it will drop, potentially somewhat precipitously," he said. "And then I think we very easily could see another surge in the fall and winter" of this year, he added.

With billions of people around the world yet to be vaccinated and little chance now of eliminating the virus, we can expect more outbreaks in classrooms, on public transport and in workplaces over the coming months, as economies push ahead with reopening. Even as immunization rates rise, there will always be people who are vulnerable to the virus: Newborn babies, people who can't or won't get inoculated, and those who get vaccinated but suffer breakthrough infections as their protection levels ebb.

The next few months will be rough. One key danger is if a vaccine-resistant variant develops, although it is not the only risk ahead. "We're going to see hills and valleys, at least for the next several years as we get more vaccine out. That's going to help. But the challenge is going to be: How big will the hills and valleys be, in terms of their distance?" Osterholm said. "We don't know. But I can just tell you, this is a coronavirus forest fire that will not stop until it finds all the human wood that it can burn."

Almost everyone will be either infected or vaccinated before the pandemic ends, the experts agree and maybe both. An unlucky few will contract the virus more than once. Plus there is always a percentage of those vaccinated who fail to develop immunity from vaccinations. The race between the waves of transmission that lead to new variants and the battle to get the globe inoculated won't be over until the coronavirus has touched all of us. We need to brace for more of what we've already been through.
