<u>Tuesday Night Vespers Service – Tues. September 28th</u>




5:30 - 6:00 p.m. - Viles Arboretum (benches behind the visitor's center).

If it is raining, this event is CANCELLED and will be rescheduled to Tuesday, October 12 at 5:30pm.



Update from COVID-19 Advisory Group

The plan for reopening UUCC for in-person, indoor gatherings approved by the Board on August 12, 2021 depends on the COVID-19 pandemic being under control in our state and county. The Delta variant of the virus (now widely circulating in Maine) is primarily affecting unvaccinated individuals, but some fully vaccinated folks are being infected and a few are getting very sick despite immunization.

The Board adopted a Maine CDC metric that measures "community (person to person) transmission" of the virus. We are closely monitoring this metric for both our county and the entire state (since the virus does not pay attention to county lines on the map). We sought expert advice from an infectious disease specialist and have set an upper safe limit of 10 new cases of COVID-19 per 10,000 people based upon the 14 day average. *If either county or state are over 10, it is not safe for us to reopen*. This data is published by the Maine CDC every Thursday morning (see below for how to access this information for yourself).

The necessary CDC metric for us to reopen is no more than 10 new cases per 10,000 people. The present CDC metric data means that there is currently too much COVID-19 activity for us to safely reopen.

- 5. We are using the 14 day "Case Data" (middle 4 columns) "Rate per 10,000" for Kennebec County and the total for the State.

Dr. Don on COVID-19 On "Breakthrough Infections"

Vaccines offer strong protection against severe illness and death, however none are ever 100% effective. Although the COVID vaccines in use have proven to be extraordinarily protective against COVID-19 infection, it is unfortunately true that some people who are fully vaccinated will be infected. These are known as "breakthrough infections" and they have become more common as the highly contagious Delta variant has become the dominant strain of the virus.

A third of people having breakthrough infections will be unaware of their condition as they are symptom free. For those experiencing breakthrough COVID infections the top five symptoms are headache, sneezing, runny nose, sore throat and loss of smell. Notably absent are fever and persistent cough, which are in the top five for unvaccinated people, according to the data compiled by U.K. researchers. A small percentage of those with breakthrough infections will require hospitalization and an even smaller percentage of these individuals will become COVID fatalities.

As hospitalizations for COVID-19 have risen in recent weeks, State of Maine officials have noticed an increase in the number of fully vaccinated individuals being admitted. Of this vaccinated group being hospitalized, many have underlying health problems. The overwhelming majority of hospitalized COVID patients have not been vaccinated and they are also the most ill making up almost all of those requiring intensive care and mechanical ventilation. During a media briefing, Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention Director Dr. Nirav Shah said 70 to 75 percent of people currently hospitalized with COVID-19 are unvaccinated, which is a bit lower than the 80 percent or more from a few weeks ago. That means as many as one in four hospitalized COVID-19 patients are so-called breakthrough cases, or people who have contracted the virus even though they are fully vaccinated.

Shah said that breakthrough cases, as well as related hospitalizations, were "predicted and predictable." He said they remain a "rarity" and should not be cause for alarm. Josh Michaud, associate director for Global Health Policy at the Kaiser Family Foundation, agreed that breakthrough cases should not be considered a major concern, nor should they be used as a reason to say the vaccines are not working. "The bottom line with the vaccines we have is that they are very effective at preventing severe disease, hospitalization and death, and that includes from the delta variant," he said. "Does that mean they are an invulnerable shield? Of course not."

There is overwhelming data that suggest the risk of being hospitalized or dying from COVID-19 is dramatically lower among vaccinated individuals. In fact, breakthrough cases are more common in a place like Maine, which has a high rate of vaccination. "A small percentage of a larger number can still be a large number," Michaud said.

Added Shah: "Even though there are more breakthrough cases, you would still rather live in a community where 90 percent of the people are vaccinated rather than 30 percent, even though you're going to have fewer break-through cases in the 30 percent."
