

COVID-19 Updates / News

Update from COVID-19 Advisory Group

The plan for reopening UUCC for in-person, indoor gatherings approved by the Board on August 12, 2021 depends on the COVID-19 pandemic being under control in our state and county. The Board adopted a Maine CDC metric that measures "community (person to person) transmission" of the virus.

The necessary CDC metric for us to reopen is no more than 10 new cases per 10,000 people in Kennebec County or the State of Maine.



The present CDC metric data indicates that it is still unsafe for us to safely reopen.

Please note that discussions are taking place around reassessing the re-opening plan approved by the Board in August. The discussions may lead to a changing of the metrics OR to reopening the church. Discussions are continuing at the COVID-19 Advisory group meeting this evening and the Board meeting next Thursday. . More information will come. Stay tuned...

Dr. Don on COVID 19 The Arrival of Omicron in Maine

In the last three weeks of 2021 the Omicron Variant of COVID-19 accounted for 1%, then 5.5% and in the final week of the year it was 8.8% of new Maine infections. The growth of new COVID infections in Maine can fairly be called explosive.

During a Monday appearance on the public radio program Maine Calling, state CDC director Dr. Nirav Shah said the omicron variant is not yet causing a majority of cases in Maine, but it may only be a matter of time. "It's expanding at such a pace that it will not be long before Omicron is at least on equal footing as the Delta variant, if not having overtaken it entirely," he said.

Unfortunately the result in Maine has been new rise in the number of patients hospitalized with COVID-19. The Maine CDC reports that 369 people are currently in the hospital with the disease — that's up from around 330 a week ago. But it's still below the state's record-high total of 384, which was set in mid-December. Of those, 113 patients are in critical care and 54 are on ventilators.

Even more worrying is the state CDC graph for positivity rates in the COVID tests being performed. This rate has reached an all-time high nearing 20%, telling us that the infection is both wide-spread and rising.

The rapid increase of Omicron and the continuing extreme demand on hospitals and overburdened healthcare workers continues to trouble hospitals, and particularly those in our largest cities. In a unanimous vote of the city council in Portland this week a mask mandate has been reimposed for all indoor public activity. The only exception is for those public facilities which already require full vaccination. The vaccine mandate already in place for public sector workers also continues with added emphasis on booster shots which have been repeatedly shown to prevent hospitalization of those infected with the new variant.

Maine vaccination clinics are busy and more widely available with "pop-up" clinics being utilized in remote locations. Nationally and here in Maine booster doses of the vaccines are now available for 12 to 15 year olds. "There's no doubt in the scientific community that these vaccines have blunted the pandemic in really meaningful ways," said Dr. Laura Blaisdell, a South Portland pediatrician and infectious disease expert. "The science and the data doesn't lie."
