A Message from the Minister

Beloveds, what's on your minds this week? I have been thinking about our calling as Unitarian Universalists. My sermon last Sunday was on efforts in our association and our faith to widen the circle to become more diverse and inclusive. I shared my thoughts on the UUA's report Widening the Circle of Concern. I would love you to join me in reading it. You can find it here (https://www.uua.org/uua-governance/committees/cic/widening). You can even listen to it. There are audio recordings that accompany each section.

On a related note, I sent a letter to the Augusta Planning Board opposing the proposed relocation of the Melville Fuller statue to 33 Winthrop Street. The proposal wants to create a park and museum to honor the statue. The UUCC Social Justice Committee also sent a letter opposing the museum. Here is an excerpt from my letter: "The statue and the proposed museum would go against our ideals of a welcoming city. It sends a message to brown and black people that they are not welcome and that Augusta, instead, honors white supremacy. I am a minister. My moral grounding reminds me to honor every person's inherent worth and dignity. As a part of that ideal, I believe in creating a warm and welcoming environment for all. I hope that the planning board shares my ideals and will vote against the proposed museum." LD 1626 is the Tribal Sovereignty bill that will restore self-governance to Maine's Wabanaki Tribes, much of which they lost in the 1980 Settlement Acts. <u>MUUSAN supports LD 1626.</u> The bill's hearing before the legislature's judiciary committee is set for Tuesday, February 15th at 9 am.

The Wabanaki Alliance and its coalition of over 100 ally groups are aiming for the committee to receive 500 or more written testimonies in support of this legislation – and you can help get us there!



COVID-19 Updates / News

Update from COVID-19 Advisory Group

The plan for reopening UUCC for in-person, indoor gatherings approved by the Board on August 12, 2021 depends on the COVID-19 pandemic being under control in our state and county. The Board adopted a Maine CDC metric that measures "community (person to person) transmission" of the virus.

The necessary CDC metric for us to reopen is no more than 10 new cases per 10,000 people in Kennebec County or the State of Maine.



The present CDC metric data indicates that it is still unsafe for us to safely reopen.

Discussions continue around reassessing the re-opening plan approved by the Board in August. The discussions may lead to a changing of the metrics OR to reopening the church. Discussions are continuing at the COVID-19 Advisory group meeting and Board meetings. More information will come. Stay tuned...

Dr. Don on COVID-19 The Current Maine COVID Decline

COVID-19 hospitalizations declined again early this week, and the number of patients is now 25 percent lower than the January peak as the omicron wave continues to subside in Maine. The pace of positive tests submitted to the state each weekday also continues to fall, dropping more than 50 percent over the past three weeks.

The number of hospital patients and positive tests remain much higher than during previous surges of the pandemic. This steady decline follows a pattern experienced in other parts of the country and the world where the Omicron variant led to a spike in infections followed by a sharp drop. Critical care utilization is also falling, from 133 ICU patients on Dec. 19 to 79 on Monday, a 41 percent decrease. COVID deaths are also in decline.

The drop in hospitalizations led Maine Medical Center to announce Monday that it will ease some visitor restrictions it has had since December. MMC now will allow one visitor per day for non-COVID-patients. Masking requirements remain, and the ongoing patient load means the hospital continues to postpone elective medical procedures like joint replacement surgery.

Speaking to the recent COVID data, Dr. Nirav Shah, director of the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention, said in a tweet on Monday, "These numbers are better than they have been, but still challenging. In other countries around the world that also came down from their Omicron surge, the question is how far did they go? In some countries they went back to their Delta or pre-Delta baseline. In other countries, like for example the UK, they came down but still at a level that was higher than they were at before. And in... at least two countries, Denmark and Norway, they are going the opposite direction back up. So the question for me is the data right now are encouraging but we need more of it to really get a sense of what the latter part of our curve will look like."

Clearly individuals, organizations and businesses are fatigued. Many are very willing to set aside COVID precautions if they have not already done so. To separate itself from the politics, emotion and exhaustion, the sciences, as always, utilize mathematics and statistics. This has never lent itself to glitzy presentation or ease of explanation. Adding in the complexity of the science itself, it's easy to see how messages are easily corrupted by polished performers, charlatans and the loud uninformed. I see the current statistics and mentally cross my fingers and hope. When I look at the charts and graphs I see this is the fifth decline in COVID numbers and that each of the previous four declines was followed by a new and very rapid increase in COVID numbers. I remain hopeful, but tempered by COVID science and recent history.
