Dale's Annual UUCC Tomato Babies and Vegetable Sale

It's time to think about gardening and here to help you is the link to the 2022 catalog. Click here to browse the catalog: Tomato Babies and Veggies Catalog

I thought I'd give you the list early to help you plan your garden or what you want to put in pots on your porch. I also have planted more of what you liked last year so I wouldn't run out. I have started 20-40 kale and basil plants because those were the most popular plants last year. I added up all the 2021 orders for tomatoes and planted a few more of your favorites: Ultra Girl, German Pink, Oregon Spring, Sungold and Sweet 100, Moonglow, Wapsipinicon Peach.

I have started more yellow tomatoes this year because they are low in acid and taste great. **New** this year are: Yellow Brnadywine, Mandarin Cross, Pork Chop tomato, Sungold cherry tomatoes, Dwarf Blue Kale, Italian smooth leaf kale, Albino beet with succulent greens, Parsley, cukes and chard.

My plants have been transplanted once into deep containers. Re-potting tomatoes up to the lowest set of leaves increases their root systems. The fuzzy part of the lower stem produces new roots and that is why my tomatoes are healthy and produce well. When you plant them in the ground or a pot and again bury then up to the lower leaves, you are increasing the root system still more. That's why my tomatoes are worth \$5 and the veggies are worth \$4. And don't forget all the money goes to the church.

You can fill out your orders now or wait till later. Pick up time will be during the second half of May.

YOU ARE AMAZING!!! UKRAINE FUNDRAISING UPDATE

"Your contributions are incredibly useful, they are needed, and they are so much appreciated." This is a quote from my son and daughter-in-law in Czech Republic when I spoke with them earlier today.

You are among 75+ people who raised more than \$14,000 in the past month to directly benefit refugees from Ukraine who are pouring into the Czech Republic. As of two days ago, the Czech government reported more than 300,000 refugees have arrived in the past few weeks. And many more are expected as the bombing in western Ukraine accelerated this weekend.

Here are some of the ways your donations are being spent this week: completed repairs and purchased supplies for a small cottage that is ready to receive two or three refugees and their pets by tomorrow; purchased much needed supplies for two of the refugee shelters in Prague. This includes items for children, canned goods and other food, and first aid supplies.

My family members living in a small village in the Czech Republic report that support from many parts of the world is overwhelming and extremely gratifying. Thank you so much for being part of this effort.

Moving on with the Interim Process...

At a special meeting on March 24th, the Board voted to go forward with the UUA Interim Search process again this year in the hopes of securing a two-year Interim Minister.

The process will mirror what we did to bring Minister Chloe to our community. The same search committee has agreed to serve again this year. They are:

Harold Burnett, Chair, Interim Transition Team; Terry Cairn, Board Member and COVID-19 Advisory Group member; Dennis Maddi, congregant; Jill Plourd, former Board President; and Kathy Ann Shaw, Board President.

It is our hope that several other members of the congregation will be added as well.

The implications of securing a two-year interim are (at least) two-fold:

- 1. We can give ourselves the time to build on the good work that Chloe and the Transition Team did this year while allowing a new Interim the time to complete the full work of an interim period,
- 2. We will push the search for a settled minister forward to FY 2023-24.

COVID-19 Updates / News

Update from COVID-19 Advisory Group

On Thursday, March 10th, the UUCC Board of Trustees adopted a new plan to reopen the church to in person gatherings. We have adapted the recently released United States CDC Community Level assessment guide as our metric for phased reopening. This assessment guide rates each county on three separate metrics and assigns a color code of green, yellow or red based on the level of COVID risk in that county.

We will be using those color codes to determine what level of physical distancing is necessary to minimize the risk of COVID exposure to our attendees during in person church gatherings. Green = 3 foot distancing, yellow = 6 foot distancing and red = no in person gatherings. Kennebec County is currently yellow.

I am grateful for the many hours of work put in by the board, the covid advisory group, the worship arts team, building and grounds, and other volunteers to make this happen!

There will be one service on **Sunday at 10:00 am**, with ingathering music beginning at 9:50 am.

To watch the service online:

If you want to watch the service online from home, you can use this link https://boxcast.tv/chan-nel/mtifpth0utvesjqgjyej. We will use the same link every week, so please bookmark it. This link is a live video feed or live stream of the service, like watching TV. We will not have service in the UUCC Zoom room. However, we will continue to use the UUCC Zoom room for meetings and smaller interactive gatherings. To attend in person:

If you want to attend the service in person, we request that you RSVP. By RSVPing, you will help us plan out seating in the church. You can RSVP for Sunday morning worship here https://rsvp.church/r/UimVwfiQ.

Information for attending:

- Masks are required. Please wear a surgical, N-95, or KN-95 mask. Surgical masks will be
 available as you enter the church. If you choose to wear a cloth mask, we will kindly ask you to
 place a surgical mask over it.
- Keep 3 feet of physical distance, except for family units.
- All doors and windows will be open. Please bring a coat!
- There will be no singing inside at this time.
- Coffee hour will be outside on the front sidewalk, with coffee, tea, and water available after the service.

I am in the process of working with the staff to reopen the church for small group meetings. We have a great camera called an OWL, which should allow groups to meet both on zoom and in person. We expect to be open to small groups starting Monday, April 18. If your group is interested in meeting at the church, please let Lynn know, and we will get back to you with more details.

Dr. Don On COVID 19 Maine At Low Risk, But With Concern

This past week all Maine counties have been CDC classified as "Green" indicating that there is low risk of COVID infection across the entire state. This good news from last week comes however with a caveat early this week, specifically the number of patients hospitalized with COVID-19 has started to rise. The Maine CDC reported 104 people were hospitalized both Monday and Tuesday with the virus, up from 93 on Sunday. The last time Maine had more than 100 inpatients was March 18. The number had hovered in the 90s since then.

Both cases and hospitalizations had plummeted from the peak of the omicron wave in January before the decline stalled this month. The leveling off of cases and hospitalizations coincides with the spread of the omicron BA.2 subvariant, which is more contagious than the original version of omicron. The spread of BA.2 typically shows up in the US a few weeks after affecting Europe where it has already caused wide infection of the United Kingdom and Scandinavia.

The BA.2 subvariant, which is spreading in Maine and nationally, has made doctors and public health officials somewhat wary. Health experts are not expecting a major surge in hospitalizations because vaccinations are working well and prior infections provide some immunity. The increasing availability of the antiviral drug Paxlovid, a mixture of two drugs that prevents the COVID virus from building the proteins of its structure, is limiting viral effects and reducing the spread of infections. Those who are hospitalized with the virus continue to be mostly people who have not been vaccinated.

BA.2 is about 50 to 80 percent more contagious than the original omicron variant, although scientists say it does not cause more severe disease. While less severe than delta and previous strains of the virus, omicron and omicron BA.2 can still be deadly, especially for those who are unvaccinated and have higher risk factors for severe disease, such as obesity, diabetes and compromised immune systems.

The official Maine CDC report shows that 10.4 percent of samples tested in March were the BA.2 omicron subvariant, but the report lags real-time data by about two weeks. Testing by Walgreens, the retail pharmacy chain, is showing more than 70 percent of the cases in Maine are now caused by the subvariant.

The value of vaccination and booster doses for those 70 and older or at risk of serious disease due to underlying conditions is obvious.
