Restorative Justice Events, May 19th and May 21st

I am the person who has been putting mysterious articles in the E-blast about restorative justice and save the date. I now have more to say.

Our community was roiling with conflict when Covid shut us down. We did not address what was happening as well as we might have. Two years later we have a range of reactions to that conflict. We have added another layer.

When the subject of the conflict comes up, someone is sure to approach leadership to ask why it keeps coming up. It's over, done with and time to move on. There are others who respond by saying that we have never sufficiently addressed what happened and that our leadership has fallen short in this regard. This range of responses is a new layer of difficulty.

Something must be done. The Board has engaged the service of Paul Langston-Daley to help us sort this out. Paul has been an ordained UU minister for 25 years and is very familiar with UU congregations, principles and values. He has worked doing restorative justice work for some time in addition to his work with his congregation.

He will be working with a small group of us to design a tailored event to help us come to a new understanding of our community and how we want to be together. We will address the conflict as we need to. It is important to know that the purpose of this experience is for us to come away as a more connected and caring community, the community we will need to be to be ready to engage our next settled minister.

We have planned a zoom session for those with that preference. It will be on Thursday May 19 from 6-9pm in the church zoom room. For those who prefer to meet in person, we will be at the church on Saturday May 21 from 10AM to 2 PM. The time difference for the two sessions is to allow time for lunch on Saturday.

All of this information will be in the eblast over the next several weeks. Please consider attending. Your community will be better for your presence and participation.

Dale's Annual UUCC Tomato Babies and Vegetable Sale

It's time to think about gardening and here to help you is the link to the 2022 catalog. Click here to browse the catalog: <u>Tomato Babies and Veggies Catalog</u>

I thought I'd give you the list early to help you plan your garden or what you want to put in pots on your porch. I also have planted more of what you liked last year so I wouldn't run out. I have started 20-40 kale and basil plants because those were the most popular plants last year. I added up all the 2021 orders for tomatoes and planted a few more of your favorites: Ultra Girl, German Pink, Oregon Spring, Sungold and Sweet 100, Moonglow, Wapsipinicon Peach.

I have started more yellow tomatoes this year because they are low in acid and taste great. **New** this year are: Yellow Brnadywine, Mandarin Cross, Pork Chop tomato, Sungold cherry tomatoes, Dwarf Blue Kale, Italian smooth leaf kale, Albino beet with succulent greens, Parsley, cukes and chard.

My plants have been transplanted once into deep containers. Re-potting tomatoes up to the lowest set of leaves increases their root systems. The fuzzy part of the lower stem produces new roots and that is why my tomatoes are healthy and produce well. When you plant them in the ground or a pot and again bury then up to the lower leaves, you are increasing the root system still more. That's why my tomatoes are worth \$5 and the veggies are worth \$4. And don't forget all the money goes to the church.

COVID-19 Updates / News

Update from COVID-19 Advisory Group

On Thursday, March 10th, the UUCC Board of Trustees adopted a new plan to reopen the church to in person gatherings. We have adapted the recently released United States CDC Community Level assessment guide as our metric for phased reopening. This assessment guide rates each county on three separate metrics and assigns a color code of green, yellow or red based on the level of COVID risk in that county.

We will be using those color codes to determine what level of physical distancing is necessary to minimize the risk of COVID exposure to our attendees during in person church gatherings. Green = 3 foot distancing, yellow = 6 foot distancing and red = no in person gatherings. Kennebec County is currently yellow.

This link is a live video feed or live stream of the service, like watching TV. We will not have service in the UUCC Zoom room. However, we will continue to use the UUCC Zoom room for meetings and smaller interactive gatherings. We are no longer offering the live stream on our Facebook page. Please see Chloe's message on Page 1 for more details on this decision.

To attend in person:

If you want to attend the service in person, we request that you RSVP. By RSVPing, you will help us plan out seating in the church. You can RSVP for Sunday morning worship here https://rsvp.church/r/UimVwfiQ.

Information for attending:

- Masks are required. Please wear a surgical, N-95, or KN-95 mask. Surgical masks will be
 available as you enter the church. If you choose to wear a cloth mask, we will kindly ask you to
 place a surgical mask over it.
- Keep 3 feet of physical distance, except for family units.
- All doors and windows will be open. Please bring a coat!
- There will be no singing inside at this time.
- Coffee hour will be outside on the front sidewalk, with coffee, tea, and water available after the service.

We are reopening for small group meetings as of April 18th. We have a great camera called an OWL, which should allow groups to meet both on zoom and in person. We are working on setting up and testing that technology. If your group is interested in meeting at the church, please let Lynn know, and we will get back to you with more details.

Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don On COVID-19 A Dubious New Leader of COVID Politics

COVID controversies come as no surprise. When Edward Jenner pioneered the vaccination against smallpox in the 1790's, with the same vaccine still in use today, he was subjected to any number of indignities. (Look up the famous James Gillray cartoon "The Cow Pock" as an example.) But today's divisive COVID challenges have taken public health issues out of the hands of experts to the point where anyone, qualified or not, can widely obscure, defame or even vilify medical leaders and the creation and implementation of health measures.

As an increasingly popular and distressingly predictable sign of our conflict-filled times, the website Reddit has created the "Herman Cain Award" for those "who have made public declaration of their anti-mask, anti-vax, or

Covid-hoax views," only to die from COVID-19 or COVID-related complications. Herman Cain was a former presidential candidate and COVID denier who died from COVID-19 complications in 2020 after attending a Trump campaign rally in Oklahoma. And now a new name has emerged in this unfortunate conflict.

On Monday as reported in the Daily Beast news website "Judge Kathryn Kimball Mizelle in Florida threw out the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's mask mandate for air travel and other forms of mass transportation. Deaths from COVID-19, and the mask mandates intended to prevent them, may be on the wane nationwide, but whatever you think about such policies, this is the latest and most egregious example of a judge acting as a partisan warrior in the COVID-19 culture wars. Mizelle was appointed to the federal bench by President Trump in 2020. She was 33, and had been practicing law for only 8 years. She had never tried a case as a lead attorney. The Senate confirmed her even though the American Bar Association gave her a rating of "not qualified."

The Daily Beast continued, "This nominee should have been rejected by the Senate not because of her judicial philosophy and not because of her age, but because she simply didn't have the credentials and experience to be a federal judge with lifetime tenure. Now she is substituting her opinion for that of scientific professionals at the CDC, and dictating health policy in America. The outcome could be disastrous, only serving to further embolden the right-wing activists who dispute the reality of this horrifically lethal pandemic."

What are we to think? I recognize the nature of scientific research is slow and plodding, even when self-correcting its mistakes. This makes science poorly compatible with instantaneous news reporting and as a result often taken advantage of for sensational headlines and loud criticism. We seem, once again, to need to take care of ourselves. I suggest not seeking a judge or politician for medical advice or surgical skill. When all else fails, consider the eight word reaction Delta Airlines had for its employees after the judge's ruling: "remember to show understanding and patience with others." Good words, tough assignment. Take Care.
