We are all aware of the world news and feel deeply helpless for the Ukrainian people and those in neighboring countries trying to assist in this long crisis.

> THERE IS AN URGENT NEED FOR SINGLE LAYER, WASHED FLANNEL BLANKETS FOR BABIES AND TODDLERS.

We like them approximately 42" long (which is 1 1/4 yards.) Please finish the edges with serging, zigzag or fold and stitch. We are NOT accepting fleece blankets at this time due to the added weight.

When we have sufficient blankets to fill boxes they will be shipped off to Baranova 27 in New Jersey. Once there, our blankets will be loaded in container ships or air freighted to Odessa, Ukraine and Warsaw, Poland.

Restorative Justice Events, May 19th and May 21st

I am the person who has been putting mysterious articles in the E-blast about restorative justice and save the date. I now have more to say.

Our community was roiling with conflict when Covid shut us down. We did not address what was happening as well as we might have. Two years later we have a range of reactions to that conflict. We have added another layer.

When the subject of the conflict comes up, someone is sure to approach leadership to ask why it keeps coming up. It's over, done with and time to move on. There are others who respond by saying that we have never sufficiently addressed what happened and that our leadership has fallen short in this regard. This range of responses is a new layer of difficulty.

Something must be done. The Board has engaged the service of Paul Langston-Daley to help us sort this out. Paul has been an ordained UU minister for 25 years and is very familiar with UU congregations, principles and values. He has worked doing restorative justice work for some time in addition to his work with his congregation.

He will be working with a small group of us to design a tailored event to help us come to a new understanding of our community and how we want to be together. We will address the conflict as we need to. It is important to know that the purpose of this experience is for us to come away as a more connected and caring community, the community we will need to be to be ready to engage our next settled minister.

We have planned a zoom session for those with that preference. It will be on Thursday May 19 from 6-9pm in the church zoom room. For those who prefer to meet in person, we will be at the church on Saturday May 21 from 10AM to 2 PM. The time difference for the two sessions is to allow time for lunch on Saturday.

All of this information will be in the eblast over the next several weeks. Please consider attending. Your community will be better for your presence and participation.

Dale's Annual UUCC Tomato Babies and Vegetable Sale

It's time to think about gardening and here to help you is the link to the 2022 catalog. Click here to browse the catalog: Tomato Babies and Veggies Catalog

I thought I'd give you the list early to help you plan your garden or what you want to put in pots on your porch. I also have planted more of what you liked last year so I wouldn't run out. I have started 20-40 kale and basil plants because those were the most popular plants last year. I added up all the 2021 orders for tomatoes and planted a few more of your favorites: Ultra Girl, German Pink, Oregon Spring, Sungold and Sweet 100, Moonglow, Wapsipinicon Peach.

I have started more yellow tomatoes this year because they are low in acid and taste great. **New** this year are: Yellow Brnadywine, Mandarin Cross, Pork Chop tomato, Sungold cherry tomatoes, Dwarf Blue Kale, Italian smooth leaf kale, Albino beet with succulent greens, Parsley, cukes and chard.

My plants have been transplanted once into deep containers. Re-potting tomatoes up to the lowest set of leaves increases their root systems. The fuzzy part of the lower stem produces new roots and that is why my tomatoes are healthy and produce well. When you plant them in the ground or a pot and again bury then up to the lower leaves, you are increasing the root system still more. That's why my tomatoes are worth \$5 and the veggies are worth \$4. And don't forget all the money goes to the church.

Financial information from UUCC Treasurer for March 2022

At the recent What's on Your Mind? session, a request was made that information about the finances at UUCC be put into the e-blast. SO....Here it is!

As the treasurer, I present a draft of the monthly report to the finance committee on the first Thursday of the month meeting. Edits, corrections, questions are shared, and a final report is done for the Board meeting on the third Thursday of the month. Each report is for the previous month's income and expenses. This changes as new expenses are paid and new income is deposited into the bank accounts.

The figures below are from the March Board meeting report. They represent all activity through March 31, 2022. This is 75% of the fiscal year. There are 4 months to go to the end of the fiscal year (June 30).

Pledges paid to date: \$131,311 which is 90% of the goal of \$145,500.

Total income from all sources: \$199,018 which is 82% of budget goal of \$241,880

Annual appeal: Donations of \$6180 without the match Total expenses to March 2022: \$156,473 leaving a added yet.

positive balance of \$42,545.

Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don On COVID 19 Update On Maine's COVID Status

The Maine CDC is reporting 132 patients with the virus, up from 103 on Friday. This surge comes as a more transmissible offshoot of the so-called stealth omicron variant is gaining a foothold in Maine, making up 12 percent of cases in April, according to the state's latest COVID-19 variants report. Unvaccinated people represent roughly 67 percent of the COVID-19 patients treated in Maine hospitals through April 15, according to the Maine CDC website.

The emergence of the BA.2.12.1 strain, an offshoot of the so-called BA.2 "stealth variant," in Maine accounted for 12.4 percent of COVID-19 cases in Maine that have undergone genomic sequencing through Jackson Laboratory, according to the latest report published by the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention on Monday. That is up from 1 percent in March.

COVID transmission in Aroostook County is now considered to be high, and Franklin County is now medium, as the new subvariant continues to spread. "We are seeing lots of people with COVID," Dr. Dora Ann Mills from MaineHealth said. "This particular subvariant is actually much more contagious than the omicron variant we saw in January, which is more contagious than prior variants." Mills says the new subvariant is less severe and that it's "unlikely" that Maine will see a return to winter hospitalization levels despite the recent increases.

Dr. Laura Blaisdell, a South Portland pediatrician and infectious disease expert, said she is "relatively reassured" that the health care system will not be overwhelmed this spring despite the recent increase in hospitalizations. "We should not be shocked that we are seeing an increase in cases and hospitalizations," Blaisdell said, pointing to relaxed public health measures such as the suspension of mask mandates. But Blaisdell agreed with Mills that vaccination levels and prior infection should help keep any surges to a "hill, not a mountain. Cases are going up, but they are not going up with that same velocity that we saw with delta and omicron," Blaisdell said.

Meanwhile, COVID-19 wastewater testing from the past week is showing mixed results, but many sewer districts in Maine are reporting decreases in virus prevalence. Bangor, which had experienced a recent surge in virus levels in its wastewater, dropped to about 220,000 copies of the virus per liter of wastewater, a decline of about 80 percent compared with recent weeks.

Lewiston-Auburn also saw steep declines in virus prevalence in its wastewater. The Portland Water District's wastewater plants in Westbrook and in the East End have seen upticks but remain at relatively low levels. Brunswick, Belfast, York, Calais and Fort Kent are reporting substantial drops in virus prevalence in wastewater, but Houlton recorded a sharp increase. Augusta's numbers are relatively the same and remain at an elevated level.
