So again, thank you, I was so heartened by your participation and engagement.

I've heard from some members about their heartbreak at the news of the school shooting in Texas. If you, too, are feeling heartbreak, you are not alone. Your outrage, despair, sadness, anger, and even disconnection are normal reactions. You are not alone in your grief.

I want to share this prayer from the Episcopal Relief and Development Service:

"God of abundant love, In the aftermath of another horrific act of violence, we pray for blessing and healing in the Uvalde, Texas community. We pray for innocent lives lost, their loved ones, and all who were present during the attack and who are grappling with its aftermath. Inspire each of us to act with prophetic love so that violence has no place to grow in this world. Amen."

#### Financial information from UUCC Treasurer For April 2022

At the recent What's on Your Mind? session, a request was made that information about the finances at UUCC be put into the e-blast. SO....Here it is!

As the treasurer, I present a draft of the monthly report to the finance committee on the first Thursday of the month meeting. Edits, corrections, questions are shared, and a final report is done for the Board for the meeting on the second Thursday of the month. Each report is for the previous month's income and expenses. This changes as new expenses are paid and new income is deposited into the bank accounts.

The figures below are from the April Board meeting report. They represent all activity through April 30, 2022. This is 83% of the fiscal year. There are 2 months to go to the end of the fiscal year (June 30).

- Pledges paid to date: \$141,209 which is 97% of the goal of \$145,500.
- Annual appeal: Donations of \$12200. Thank you to the anonymous donor!
- Offering received during services: \$355.00
- Total income from all sources: \$216,600 which is 90% of budget goal of \$241,880
- Total expenses to April 30, 2022: \$ 173,405 leaving a positive balance of \$43,195.

#### **COVID-19 Advisory Group UPDATE**

#### Kennebec county is still YELLOW

As of this morning, May 25th, Kennebec county remains "yellow" per the Federal CDC color coding system.

The good news is that both hospitalizations and ICU admissions for COVID patients are gradually declining across the state. The worrisome news is that the Augusta wastewater COVID concentrations are nearly 6 times higher than the national average, meaning that there is still plenty of COVID going around in our area.

#### Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don On COVID-19 The Making Of A Successful Virus

COVID has been a disastrous and deadly illness for millions of people, but as a virus, it's been highly successful. The key to its success are mutations that make it easier for the virus to infect new hosts, as well as those previously infected. This success is likely to continue for some time.

While the mutations have resulted in new strains that tend to cause less severe symptoms, they also have made it more likely for people to be infected even after they have already had the disease or been vaccinated. The newest subvariants are also better able to infect people who have waning levels of immunity, which is why many Americans are advised to get booster doses four months after their last dose of vaccine.

The virus is likely to have the ability to continue building on its success at mutating, said Dr. Nirav Shah, head of the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention. That means anyone hoping the pandemic will end

soon is likely to be disappointed.

"The fact that it has been circulating widely for more than two years provides opportunities to mutate as humans with the virus transmit it to other humans," Shah said in an email Friday. "COVID-19 virus adapts in similar ways to other common viruses. Viruses need hosts, so they mutate in ways that ensure that they will continue to have available hosts." Although some variants seem to be less affected by vaccines and natural immunities, it's still important for people to get vaccinated and boosted, Shah said.

"Data show that being vaccinated and boosted greatly reduces the risk of hospitalization or death with any known COVID variant," he said. "The protection was strongest for the original strain and a bit less with the current strain, which is why the booster doses of the vaccine are so important, to provide the added protection needed as the virus changed.

"There is a possibility we'll get a new vaccine at some point that is based on the newer variants," Shah said. "For right now, though, we still have COVID in our communities and we need to protect ourselves and the best way to protect yourself today is with the vaccines that we have right now."
