

Dr. Don On COVID-19 Singing and Wind Instrument COVID Spread (A Reader Request)

New studies have found that the louder a person sings or talks, the more particles are spewed into the air, and that more particles are released by men than women, and by adults than children. Additional studies have confirmed that wind instruments should be considered likely to spread COVID but less than loud singing.

Fears that airborne transmission of COVID-19 could pose a risk to performers and audience members severely curtailed live performances in the early stages of the pandemic, so researchers decided to assess the levels of aerosols (tiny airborne particles less than 100 microns in size) emitted by singers, actors and musicians who play wind instruments. The following is a very brief synopsis of findings from late last year to a wind instrument study released two weeks ago.

Early studies lacked the ability to measure aerosol spread from different sized groups and males versus females versus children. Early studies also lacked clear data from instruments with a variety of air releasing openings such as seen in flutes, clarinets and related woodwind instruments.

One of the more sophisticated studies reported results late last year. This study included about 100 volunteers, ages 12 to 61, who sat or stood while talking, singing or playing instruments in an aerosol testing chamber at Colorado State University. The study found that singing produced 77% more aerosols than talking, adults produced 62% more aerosols than youngsters and males produced 34% more aerosols than females. Not surprisingly, the louder one spoke, sang or played, the greater was the release of aerosols.

Researchers also found that wind instrument playing, like singing, should be considered more dangerous than speaking or breathing. They found that aerosol emission rates were more dependent on the individual playing and their playing techniques rather than the type of instrument played. Researchers also confirmed that their findings were consistent with earlier results showing wind instruments, in general, generate a higher number of aerosol particles than breathing and speaking but less than speaking and singing at high volume.

A separate study attempted to reduce instrument aerosol release. In it an oboist, clarinettist, and trumpeter played with a surgical mask over their instrument bell. Unfortunately the researchers found no difference between the aerosol emission rates from playing with and without masks. I will seek out results from studies utilizing additional filtering techniques.
