after a 10:00 am Interfaith Pride service at First Parish in Portland, UU, 425 Congress St!

Each year MUUSAN pays the registration fee for the Pride Portland! parade and invites all Maine UU congregations to bring their congregational banner and march as a group.

PLEASE NOTE: A congregational presence is <u>not</u> required. All UUs are welcome to march as part of MUUSAN.

The schedule is as follows:

- 10:00 Interfaith Service at First Parish in Portland, UU. Please wear masks inside the building.
- 11:15 UUs gather on the front steps of First Parish before moving to our spot in the parade.
- 11:30 Marchers begin lining up at an assigned location near Monument Square.
- 1:00 Parade starts in Monument Square and ends about 45 minutes later in Deering Oaks Park, where the PRIDE Festival runs until 5:00 pm.





Dr. Don On COVID-19 Another Variant - Is The 'New Normal" Here?

You will not be surprised to hear the following from this week's news: Maine health officials said a new variant of the coronavirus has arrived in Maine. Expect to hear this type of report again and again in the future as we begin to experience this "new normal."

In its latest sampling and testing of Mainers, the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention said it detected one case of the variant labeled BA.4, a subvariant of the omicron version of the virus. Omicron emerged earlier this year and spread rapidly through the state due to its easier transmission when compared to prior COVID variants.

State officials have not released any more information about the test that turned up the new version of the coronavirus, such as where in the state it was found or anything about the person who contracted it.

"It's more transmissible than previous variants, so it's not surprising that genome testing would detect it in Maine," Dr. Nirav D. Shah, director of the Maine CDC, said in a statement. Shah previously has said that he believes the COVID-19 pandemic has now entered a stage where the virus will "ebb and flow," as new variants emerge, spread and then fade. These new variant viruses will again establish themselves in those unprotected either by lack of vaccination or diminishing immunity which occurs over time.

When previous variants have turned up in the state, Shah recommended that Mainers stay up to date on vaccines and boosters and talk to a medical provider about getting therapeutic treatments quickly if they test positive for COVID. As I mentioned in a previous article, when taken within five days of initial symptoms the COVID antiviral drug Paxlovid from Pfizer, has shown a remarkable 90% prevention of hospitalizations and deaths in those most at risk.

Meanwhile, the number of hospitalized patients with COVID-19 in Maine has held steady over the past several days. There were 137 patients hospitalized statewide as of Monday morning, including 18 in critical care and six on ventilators. That's up slightly from 135 patients on Sunday but well down from 169 just a few weeks ago.

BA.4 was first identified in South Africa, although that doesn't mean that it developed there. South Africa has a robust public health system and new variants are often identified there first. The same genetic variations in the virus can occur anywhere it is spreading and multiplying.

As always in viral epidemiology the big concern is not a new variant but an all "new" easily spread virus to which none of us has previous exposure or immunity.
