Dr. Don on COVID-19 COVID Vaccination for the Youngest Mainers

Maine kids between the ages of 6 months and 5 years are now eligible to get vaccinated against COVID-19 after federal regulators approved both Pfizer and Moderna vaccines for young children this past weekend. As reported in the Portland Press Herald, some locations in the state began receiving vaccines on Monday, while more doses are expected to arrive in the next few weeks.

In clinical trials, the Pfizer vaccine was roughly 80 percent effective in preventing symptomatic COVID-19 infection after three doses, while the Moderna vaccine was 51 percent effective against symptomatic COVID-19 among children between the ages of 6 months to 2 years and 37 percent effective among those aged 2 to 5 years. The Pfizer vaccine is administered in three doses, while the Moderna vaccine is just two doses, although a third dose may be approved at some point. Both child vaccines come in significantly smaller doses than their adult counterparts.

While severe illness among children who contract COVID-19 is rare, 58 kids under age 5 have been hospitalized with the virus in Maine since the start of the pandemic, according to data from the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention.

Maine's largest health care providers, including MaineHealth and Northern Light Health, are encouraging parents to contact their pediatrician or primary care provider to schedule a vaccination appointment. Vaccinations for the youngest children are also available sooner at walk-in sites, such as the York Emergency Management Agency site in Sanford, and at 15 Walgreen's pharmacy locations statewide for kids aged 3 and older.

State health officials have said they expect a relatively high percentage of Maine families to choose to vaccinate their young children because the state has consistently had one of the nation's highest rates of overall vaccination. But this doesn't mean most parents of preschoolers are rushing to get the shots. Physicians encountered resistance when the vaccines were rolled out to 5 to 12-year-olds, with ambivalent parents saying they would wait and see if the shots were really needed.

More than seven months after those children became eligible, just 42 percent of Maine kids between 5 and 11 years old have been fully vaccinated, according to the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention. That compares to 78 percent of all Maine people over 5 years old and 90 percent of people 90 and over.
