Dr. Don on Covid-19

Dr. Don on COVID-19 Endemic Has Arrived - So Long but Not Goodbye

COVID has entered a phase that has been expected by medical researchers. It has become a part of everyday life, not seasonal like the many influenza viruses, but having the same characteristics of changing to produce new variants. Each year the federal CDC conducts foreign monitoring during our summer to try and determine which flu variants will arrive the next winter and what new vaccine will best prevent infection. COVID has become a part of year-round everyday life, like the common cold, but with its nearly two thousand different types making immunity and vaccine development impossible.

COVID is with us for the long haul. The same variants are created here as are first seen elsewhere. Or they arrive with the next plane full of passengers, some of whom are healthy but are carriers of a new COVID that may have even developed in their bodies. The COVID virus is genetically unstable and produces new types, some so damaged that they fail to reproduce. Others show traits that make themselves more capable of infection and being shed from new human hosts. Some existing immunity is no longer effective in preventing them from sickening those previously infected or vaccinated.

In a case of pure Darwinian evolution, the more effective a strain of virus is in reproducing in us the more likely it will spread new waves of disease. What we see now with COVID infecting those previously infected or vaccinated will continue. It may become an annoyance like the common cold, constantly present but not commonly dangerous. It could also mutate into an entirely new form which no one will have defense against.

I wish, like the mythological Cassandra, I could see the future, but like Cassandra if I did see ahead I would likely not be believed and cast aside. We have been led and conditioned to mistrust and only accept what we feel is right. Experts have such little standing with some of the citizenry that they are immediately dismissed or worse, physically threatened. This lack of trust works against us.

So after 90 plus of these articles it seems time to say so long, but not goodbye. When the situation (not if, but
