Social Activities Committee and the Lifespan Faith Formation Coordinator are collaborating to present movies that depict "social equity issues" that are important to our church.



Board of Trustees

Board Highlights: from the June 9, 2022 (final meeting for FY21-22 meeting):

- The Treasurer's report was identical to the report presented to the congregation at the annual Meeting.
- The report of the Invested Funds committee also was the same as for the Annual Meeting.
- The Finance Committee reported on the impact of the stock market fluctuations, the strength of fundraising and stewardship efforts and recommended that \$250.00 be used to fund David Rand's registration fee for General Assembly.
- The Covid-19 Task Force recommended some changes to their guidelines for the church which the Board passed.
- Nancy Fritz as incoming Treasurer reminded the Board that signatures need to be updated on church accounts because of changes in officers. The Board named Nancy Fritz, Michaela Loisel as incoming President and Harry Grimmnitz as chair of Finance to be the designated signatories.
- There was discussion of the Interim Search situation.
- The Board agreed to meet in July.
- There was a vote not to rent the currently vacant space in Judd House to see if the church itself can make use of it.
- The final item was a discussion of Choe's evaluation.

Board Highlights: from the July 14, 2022 meeting:

- There was no Treasurer's report as the end of year expenses are still being tallied. There may be a small carryover to next year.
- Marilyn Dunn, Chair of Invested Funds has been given access to the church's Endowment accounts.
- The Board voted to allow the incoming part-time interim minister, Christina Sillari and Treasurer, Nancy Fritz, to become signatories on the minister's discretionary fund.
- The Finance Committee reported that they met with the new bookkeeper. They also reported that the

Carie Johnsen Social Justice Fund has raised nearly enough funds to be self- sustaining.

- The hiring of part-time minister Christina Sillari was announced. She has signed a one-year contract. She will preach twice a month, from September through June, including Christmas Eve and will also provide pastoral care and staff supervision.
- Sean Fritz was appointed to the Committee on Ministry.
- Catherine Emery and Susan Burnett will begin planning a Board Retreat to be held on Sunday, September 18.
- Kathy Shaw, Michaela Loisel and Harry Grimmnitz will form a working group to decide on next steps for the reconciliation process outlined by Rev. Paul Langston-Daley.
 The next Board Meeting will be August 11.
