Dear members and friends of UUCC.

I am feeling excited about our ministry together. It has been great getting to know some of you. The topic of covenant has been coming up in leadership conversations. Covenants are created from the values we hope to live by in our relationships with each other. I am wondering what values you aspire to uphold and convey at UUCC.

During our first Sunday together, on September 11th, we will explore the spirit and consciousness of water. Understanding water enables us to sense imbalances in life-sustaining systems. Five and a half years ago, I joined a crowd of people in the Fellowship Hall at St. Mark's Episcopal Church to talk about creating a structure to welcome and support immigrants and refugees in the Capital Area. Dotted among the crowd were other members of our church. The energy in the room was high; we wanted to help create and sustain an integrated and thriving community in Central Maine. From this meeting and many more, Capital Area New Mainers Project (CANMP) emerged.

Members of our church have continued to be an integral part of CANMP. Currently, three members of the Social Justice Committee are part of a Family Mentor Team for a family of 5 from Afghanistan. We are trying to find a coordinator for the 1st Saturday Community Dinner. Below is an idea of what is needed. Pre-Covid the UU church was very involved so I was hoping someone might want to help. There is an opportunity this weekend to job shadow if someone wanted to.

Thank you for your help,

Coordinator

- come up with a plan for the next supper (with Keith) during the current supper for the following month. This is often based on what is available for meat/protein in the freezer.
- Check with the food bank for bulk vegetables or purchase through Sam's club enough in advance for delivery.
- Email the food bank letting them know our plan for the next month's supper and request items we need.
- Need someone to send out a monthly email to volunteers two weeks ahead of time asking for help and requesting them to "reply all" to the message.
- The week prior to the supper check the kitchen at So. Parish to make sure there are take-out containers and any other supplies that might need to be purchased.
- If having a meal that requires cooked ground beef or chicken, will usually start cooking a few days before so it is ready to go into whatever is being made on the day of the supper. This cuts down on the amount of prep time on the day of the meal.
- On the day of the meal assist the cook in prepping.
- Most of the current volunteers know what needs to be done when they arrive and they just pitch in and help.
- Bring dirty laundry home for washing and return to the Church.
- If Heidi is unavailable, take recycling.
- Send an invoice to the UU Church (every six months or so) for \$35.00 per month rental fee for the hall.

You will see from this notice that the long-standing debate re: supper (a/k/a "suppa") and "dinner" continues... Nonetheless, if you are interested in more information about this coordinator position or if you are considering taking on this task, please contact admin@augustauu.org.

Covid precautions update from the Board:

At the August 11th Board meeting, the Board voted unanimously to accept the Covid Advisory Team's recommendation that pulpit presenters and Worship Arts Associates be allowed to remove masks during services, provided other presenters accept that choice.

The Board, in consultation with the Covid Advisory Team will continue to monitor and consider how we can most effectively balance congregational safety, comfort and community connection within our church premises.

In the works is a plan to hold a town-hall type meeting to discuss this further with all who are interested. Stay tuned for the details as they unfold.

Board Highlights: from the August 11, 2022 meeting:

At the August 11, 2022 meeting:

- The Treasurer reported a carryover from fiscal year 21-22 of \$17,562.
- In other financial matters:
 - The Board approved the adjustment of the fy22-23 budget to reflect that the need for withdrawals from the money market and UUCC endowment funds was eliminated. The revised income is \$217,230 and revised expenses total \$213,424.
 - > There was a unanimous vote to accept the recommended changes to the MUUSAN Fiscal Sponsorship Agreement. There was a unanimous vote to accept the recommended changes to the Rental Agreement for Drew House to Capitol Area New Mainers.
 - There was a unanimous vote to accept Rev Sillari's housing allowance form.
 - > UUCC has applied for a \$7600 IRS tax refund as part of the federal CARES Act for Employee Retention Credit during the pandemic.
 - Nancy Fritz was authorized to open a new account at Kennebec Savings to hold the \$1000 security deposit for Drew House tenants.
- There was a discussion of the need for a community discussion to discern the risk tolerance for Covid-19 and ways to move forward.
- There was a unanimous vote to accept the Covid-19 Advisory team's recommendation that pulpit presenters and Worship Associates be allowed to remove masks during services provided other presenters accept the choice.

There will be a Board retreat on September 18.
